FUNDING SOURCE:	Children’s Board of Hillsborough County
RECOMMENDED ACTION:	Authorize staff to execute contracts with the Children’s Board of Hillsborough County and three (3) partner agencies (subcontractors).

BACKGROUND:

In 2012, the Early Learning Coalition of Hillsborough County collaborated with local agencies to develop a response to the Children’s Board of Hillsborough County’s Request for Proposals. Partner agencies include:

- Champions for Children
- University of South Florida
- Early Childhood Council of Hillsborough County

The Quality Counts for Kids Program was one of thirty-three (33) recommended for funding. As the lead agency, the Coalition will receive \$1,834,107 for the project from CBHC.

As the lead agency for the CBHC Quality Counts for Kids Program, the Coalition is responsible for the execution of contracts with the partner agencies (sub-contractors). If approved, staff will execute subcontracts for the period October 1, 2015 through September 30, 2016. The recommended funding for each agency can be found in the chart below:

RECOMMENDED ACTION:	Authorize staff to execute a contract with Hillsborough County Public Schools in the amount of \$1,825,339 for the period October 1, 2015 to September 30, 2016.

BACKGROUND:

Historically, the Children’s Board of Hillsborough County has allocated funds totaling \$1,723,239 to:

- Support the required match for funds used to serve low-income working families (Billing Group 8) **\$ 805,339**
- Support the 1:1 match required by the Child Care Executive Partnership **\$897,900**; and
- Provide services to children and families who receive services through Metropolitan Ministries. **\$20,000**

Additionally, Hillsborough County has provided funding through child care fees and licenses to support other necessary child care services and supports that may be used to support the additional \$102,100 for the \$1,000,000 Child Care Executive Partnership match.

For FY2015-2016, the Coalition, with Board approval, will continue to contract with the Hillsborough County Public Schools consistent with the funding earmarks established by the Children’s Board of Hillsborough County and Hillsborough County.

The Coalition has signed the CBHC contract and anticipate the contract to be returned effective October 1, 2015 in the amount \$1,723,239. In addition, this was approved at the CBHC board meeting on September 24, 2015. Additionally, staff will utilize funds from Hillsborough County in a contract executed July 1, 2015 for the additional \$102,100 for the Child Care Executive Partnership Match. These funds are used solely to provide direct child care services.

Once the contract with CBHC is executed, funds will be available for the period October 1, 2015 to September 30, 2016.

RECOMMENDED ACTION:	It is recommended that the Early Learning Coalition Board of Directors ratify the results of the Private Child Care Provider Representative Election and confirm Mary Hancock as the Private Child Care Provider Representative for a four year term to begin Tuesday, October 13, 2015 and end Monday, October 14, 2019.

BACKGROUND:

On April 20, 2015 Sally Harris officially resigned her seat on the Early Learning Coalition of Hillsborough County’s Board of Directors as the Private Child Care Provider Representative. This Board seat is considered a ‘Designated Director’ and per the Coalition’s historical preference, the representative that occupies this seat must be elected by a vote of his/her constituents.

In order to fill the vacant seat, staff launched an official election process that began with a Nomination phase on Wednesday, July 15, 2015. Providers were given until Friday, August 28, 2015 at 3:00 pm to submit nomination forms that asked each candidate to state their professional skills and background as well as deliver a personal statement regarding their desire to serve on the Board as a representative of the private child care community in Hillsborough County. The nomination phase yielded five candidates whose applications were made public on the ELCHC website for review and consideration by the provider community.

The voting phase of the election process began on Tuesday, September 1, 2015 at 8:00 am and closed on Friday, September 25, 2015 at 4:00 pm. The election was by plurality vote with final results illustrated in the table below:

ISSUE: FINANCE REPORT as of **August 31, 2015**

School Readiness

School Readiness (SR) expenditures for July 2015 through August 2015 were \$6,723,122. This is a total of OEL SR (\$6,338,024) and CBHC SR Match (\$385,098). The direct services (slots) portion is \$5,293,961. Due to low enrollment, year to date child care slots expenditures are approximately 1.28% lower than budgeted. The freeze on enrollment has been lifted in order to reduce the projected surplus. Administrative costs were \$172,841, or 2.72% of total OEL SR expenditures which is below the mandated cap of 5%. Quality expenditures were \$522,579. Total operating costs, which include administrative, program support, and quality expenditures, were \$1,044,063, or 16.48% of total OEL SR expenditures. The mandated cap for operating costs is 22%.

Voluntary Pre-kindergarten

Voluntary Pre-kindergarten expenditures for July 2015 through August 2015 totaled \$3,165,050. The direct services (slots) portion is \$3,019,548. Due to the normally low enrollment in July, this is approximately 2.80% lower than budgeted. Historically, July is a low enrollment month for VPK which contributes to low YTD expenditures. Administrative costs were 7.12% of direct services which is above the mandated cap of 4%. Enrollment activities have decreased substantially which will result in a decline in administrative costs. The Coalition will continue to work to contain costs associated with VPK administrative activities.

Quality Counts for Kids

Expenditures in the Quality Counts for Kids program for July 2015 through August 2015 totaled \$343,392 while revenue was \$353,573, resulting in a YTD surplus of \$10,181. The QCCK contract with CBHC is structured to allow up to 10% of program expenditures to be reimbursed as administrative costs. If administrative costs for QCCK fall below the 10% cap, a surplus is the result.

General Fund

Expenditures for the general fund, for July 2015 through August 2015 totaled \$69,573 while revenue was \$79,600. The coalition currently has a surplus in this category of \$16,960. Activity in the General Fund is generated by a combination of the Tampa Bay Institute for Early Childhood Professionals (IECP) as well as the Ready Rosie initiative, which is funded by the grant from BOCC.





Children Served - School Readiness




School Readiness Slot Expenditures






Children Served - VPK

RECOMMENDED ACTION:	Appoint a review hearing committee to comply with state requirement for due process.

Background:**The following language is taken directly from the Statewide Provider Contract**

***1. Purpose of Exhibit.** Early Learning Coalitions are responsible for the local implementation of early learning programs funded with state and federal funds, such as the School Readiness Program and Voluntary Prekindergarten Education Program. Providers of such early learning programs may request a review of determinations made by an Early Learning Coalition in accordance with the due process procedures described below.*

***Implementation of Review.** If the Coalition receives a request for review hearing from the provider, the Coalition must address the request by taking the following steps.*

- a. Assignment of Review Hearing Committee.** *Within three (3) business days of receipt of a request for review hearing, the Coalition must assign a Review Hearing Committee to complete the review. The Review Hearing Committee must be composed of at least three but no more than five members of the Coalition Board. The Chair of the ELC shall appoint the Review Hearing Committee and shall name the chair of the committee. Three of the members must be a mandatory members as set forth in section 1002.83(4) with at least one provider representative member.*

Board members appointed to the Review Committee should be aware that the obligations associated with this committee include a thorough knowledge of “provider contracts” as well as the responsibilities and consequences assumed by a provider upon signing a contract with the coalition. Coalition staff are more than willing to provide assistance to committee members.

Additionally, we can expect the number of Review Hearings to increase over the next year to address contract non-compliances. The scheduling of Review Hearings will be dictated by the Due Process Procedures attached.

Exhibit 5: Due Process Procedures

Provider Name: _____

1. **Purpose of Exhibit.** Early Learning Coalitions are responsible for the local implementation of early learning programs funded with state and federal funds, such as the School Readiness Program and Voluntary Prekindergarten Education Program. Providers of such early learning programs may request a review of determinations made by an Early Learning Coalition in accordance with the due process procedures described below.
2. **Request for Review Hearing.** If a provider disputes any action taken by the Coalition pursuant to the terms of the Statewide School Readiness Provider Contract, the provider may request a review hearing in writing by sending it to the contact person listed in the Coalition's action. A review hearing is a "meeting" for the purposes of the Sunshine Law which is subject to public notice. During a review hearing, the provider will have a reasonable opportunity to address Coalition staff-persons or sub-contractor staff regarding the Coalition's action and to present supporting evidence before a Review Hearing Committee. Provider may have an attorney present at the review hearing to represent or advise the provider.
 - a. **Content of Request for Review Hearing.** The request for review hearing must state: the name and contact information of an individual authorized to provide information and binding responses on behalf of provider; the specific action by the Coalition that the provider disputes, the specific reasons for the provider's belief; and whether the provider will be represented by an attorney or another individual during the review hearing.
 - b. **Request Time.** The provider's request for a review hearing must be submitted in writing to the Coalition within five (5) business days of receipt of notice of the determination which the provider believes to be incorrect.
 - c. **Supporting Documentation.** The provider must send copies of any written documentation supporting the claims of the provider. Examples of relevant documentation may include, but are not limited to, attendance documentation, notarized attestations from parents, documentation from licensing or accrediting bodies, documents demonstrating dates of information submission, and a proposed corrective action plan.
3. **Implementation of Review.** If the Coalition receives a request for review hearing from the provider, the Coalition must address the request by taking the following steps.
 - a. **Assignment of Review Hearing Committee.** Within three (3) business days of receipt of a request for review hearing, the Coalition must assign a Review Hearing Committee to complete the review. The Review Hearing Committee must be composed of at least three but no more than five members of the Coalition Board. The Chair of the ELC shall appoint the Review Hearing Committee and shall name the chair of the committee. Three of the members must be a mandatory member as set forth in section 1002.83(4) with at least one provider representative member.
 - b. **Response to Request for Review Hearing.** Within five (5) business days of receipt of the request for review hearing, the Coalition must respond to the provider in writing,

return receipt requested. The notice must include at least three (3) proposed dates and times for the review hearing which must be within forty-five (45) days of the date of receipt of the request for review hearing. The notice must also state that the review hearing may be conducted in person at a location designated by the Coalition or via any method of telecommunications, as long as the public is given reasonable access to observe and, when appropriate, participate. Finally, the notice must state whether or not all of the Coalition staff persons or sub-contractor staff whom the provider wishes to have present during the hearing will be made available. If any individual whom the provider requested to have present is not available, the Coalition must make available an individual who is qualified to address the subjects the provider wished the individual to address.

- c. Date and Location Selection.** Within five (5) business days of receipt of the response to a request for review hearing, the provider must inform the Coalition of the date and time which it selects for the review hearing and whether the provider will attend the meeting in person or via a method of telecommunication. Within five (5) business days of receipt of the response to a request for review hearing, if the provider is unable to attend any of the proposed dates and times for the review hearing, the provider must submit written notice which states the specific reasons that provider is unable to attend and must contact the Coalition to select a mutually agreed upon date for the review hearing. If the provider does not inform the Coalition of the date and time within the required time period, then the process is considered complete and the request is denied.
- d. Conducting the Review Hearing.** The Review Hearing Committee shall assess the claim(s) the provider made in its request for review by examining all information and documentation submitted by the provider. The provider must be given a reasonable opportunity to question Coalition staff-persons or sub-contractor staff regarding the determinations of the Coalition and to present evidence before the Review Hearing Committee. The Coalition will also be provided a reasonable opportunity to submit evidence to rebut any claims made by the provider.
- e. Notice of Review Hearing Conclusion.** Following completion of the presentation by the provider and the Coalition, the Review Hearing Committee will vote regarding each of the provider's claims. The Review Hearing Committee must also appoint a Review Hearing Committee member or a Coalition staff person to prepare a written notice of the review hearing conclusion. (If the notice is developed by a Coalition staff person, the notice must be reviewed by the Review Hearing Committee in a subsequent public meeting and approved before being sent to the provider.) The written notice must state the outcome of the Review Hearing Committee's vote regarding each of the provider's claims. In addition, the notice must specifically state the reasons supporting the Review Hearing Committee's conclusions. Finally, if the majority of the Review Hearing Committee determines:

 - i.** That no part of the determination made by the Coalition was correct, the notice must state provider is not required to take further action.
 - ii.** That any part of the determination made by the Coalition is correct, the notice must identify the portion(s) determined to be correct. As applicable, the notice must also state:

- A. If corrective action is necessary, that the provider must take corrective action in regard to the part(s) which the Review Hearing Committee determines to be correct; and the revised deadlines for completion of the corrective action(s);**
- B. If the provider's School Readiness Contract or eligibility to offer the School Readiness Program will be terminated, the date of termination.**

The decision of the Review Hearing Committee is final.

ISSUE: Website RFP Selection

BACKGROUND:

In order to remain on the tight timeline for a projected site launch date of January 4, 2015, staff needed to quickly execute a contract for an amount not to exceed \$50,000 with the procured vendor in order to have a projected start date of October 1, 2015. This amount was allocated in the FY2015-16 Budget that was approved by the ELCHC Board of Directors at its regular meeting held on Monday, June 8, 2015.

To facilitate staff's request, on September 23, 2015, the ELCHC Executive/Finance Committee held a Special Meeting to approve the execution of a contract with Sparxoo as the procured vendor for the ELCHC Web Site Redesign. Attached is the Action Item memo drafted for approval by the Executive/Finance Committee at the referenced Special Meeting. Also attached is the official Reviewer Score Sheet Summary. As a result of the action taken by the ELCHC Executive/Finance Committee, staff was able to begin working with the vendor on Monday, October 5, 2015.

RECOMMENDED ACTION:	It is recommended that the ELCHC Executive Committee approve staff's execution of a contract with web design firm Sparxoo for the rebuild of the ELCHC website for an amount not to exceed \$50,000.

BACKGROUND:

On July 1, 2015 staff released a Request for Proposals (#001-2015) for the rebuild and redesign of the Early Learning Coalition of Hillsborough County (ELCHC) website at www.elchc.org. To ensure full and proper notification of the release of the RFP, staff direct mailed over 80 design firms, posted to several professional associations as well as national RFP database.

Firms interested in responding to the RFP were given until 4:00 pm on July 15, 2015 to submit a Letter of Intent to Bid. Staff received Letters of Intent to bid from 10 design firms. Firms had until July 29, 2015 to review the RFP in detail and attend a face-to-face Proposer's Conference. While the Proposers Conference was not deemed as *'required'* as part of the process, firms were strongly encouraged to attend. The Proposers Conference allowed potential proposers direct access to the point of contact for the RFP process/project and an opportunity to ask questions relating to any portion of the RFP. Three firms attended the Proposer's Conference.

On the heels of the Proposer's Conference began the Written Question and Answer Period, which ran from 9:00 am July 30, 2015 to 4:00 pm on Friday, August 7, 2015. During this phase of the process, potential proposers were allowed to submit written questions regarding the RFP. Answers to questions posed during the Proposer's Conference as well as the Written Question and Answer Period were transcribed and answered in writing on Wednesday, August 12, 2015. Responses were only sent to those firms who had submitted a Letter of Intent to Bid. This concluded the inquiry phase of the RFP process. Potential proposers then moved into writing their proposals, which were due to the Coalition by noon on Friday, August 28, 2015. The Coalition received a total of 4 proposals by the submission deadline. Of those 4 proposals, 3 were submitted as required; One proposal was disqualified for incomplete submission and was therefore not reviewed by the RFP Review team.

During the writing period, staff assembled a volunteer RFP Review Team composed of representatives of ELCHC's core 'audiences'. Board Member – Dr. Shawn Robinson, Child Care Provider – Terry Fernandez, Community Partner – Amy Haile, Parent – Rick Lence and Staff – Tracie T. White. All members of the RFP Review Team received the full RFP, original copies of all submitted proposals and the Written Question and Answer documents as well as rating sheets for each proposal. The team entered into the formal RFP review period on Monday, August 31, 2015 and concluded their evaluations and ratings on Friday, September 4, 2015 as scheduled. At its final meeting, the RFP Review Team concluded that only one proposal, submitted by a firm called Sparxoo, scored high enough to warrant a final presentation to the team.

On September 15, 2015 at 9:30 am a team representing Sparxoo presented to the RFP Review Team offering an opportunity for the team to ask questions and gain additional clarifications about the qualifications of the firm and their proposal. At the conclusion of the Sparxoo presentation the RFP team confirmed their earlier scores and agreed that Sparxoo was the best firm to satisfy the terms and the vision of the ELCHC as outlined in the RFP.

Policies, Procedures, & Forms

Board of Directors Attendance Policy

Scope: This policy applies to all members of the Board of Directors of the Early Learning Coalition of Hillsborough County.

Reason for Policy: To ensure that board members contribute their expertise and judgment to the business and affairs of the Early Learning Coalition of Hillsborough County by attending and participating in board meetings.

Policy Statement: Board members are expected to attend all board meetings. It is recognized that directors may be unable to attend some meetings due to conflicts with other commitments or other unforeseen circumstances. Members may attend meetings telephonically.

Process: If a board member fails to attend two meetings of the board in a 12-month period the chair shall discuss the reasons for the absences with the member. Upon the third absence the Chair may ask the individual to resign.

The member's response will promptly be shared by the Chair with the entire board at the next board meeting. At that meeting, the board will decide what actions to take regarding the board member's future membership on the board. If the board decides to terminate the board member's membership, termination will be conducted as specified in the Coalition's by-laws.

If the board member is an *ex-officio* member of the board, the chair may discuss the member's attendance with the organization the member is affiliated with, and such organization may be requested to remove the member and appoint a new *ex-officio* member to the board if a delegate member is permitted by statute.

ISSUE: Child Care in South County

BACKGROUND:

The Children’s Board of Hillsborough County (CBHC) hosted a series of Town Hall meetings throughout the county during FY 2015 in an effort to gather information regarding programming needs. During the Town Hall meeting conducted in South County, early care and education emerged as a significant community concern. During the meeting families identified the following issues:

1. Lack of capacity
2. Absence of Quality
3. Affordability
4. Licensure issues
5. Families are forced to leave children with unskilled caregivers.


Total Capacity by Provider




BACKGROUND:

The attached presentation was delivered by Dr. Mimi Graham of the FSC Center for Prevention & Early Intervention to the Children’s Cabinet at its August 27, 2015 meeting in Tampa. This campaign is intended to align all the child serving groups under a single public awareness advocacy effort. The supporting research has shown that the first 1000 days in a child’s life to be the optimal time to promote development.



Florida's FIRST 1000 DAYS Campaign

- A collaborative public awareness and advocacy effort to draw attention to the importance of the critical years in a child's life – the first 1,000 days.
- To align all the children's groups and efforts under "one big tent" to have a collective impact in advancing Florida's future with maximum efficiency and effectiveness.

ISSUE: FY 2015-16 Provider Contracts

BACKGROUND:

Each year a new contract must be executed with all School Readiness providers (354 center-based and 369 family child care homes). This year's contracts (FY 2015-16) were completed by staff from the School District as part of their contract with ELCHC. This re-contracting process has been the responsibility of the School District throughout our relationship. The new FY 2015-16 contract was lengthier than those in previous years and staff from ELCHC provided the School District with the necessary instructions to complete the task.

In a recent and continuing review of the center-based and family child care contracts, ELCHC staff has discovered that the vast majority of these have noticeable concerns.

The center-based programs issues are as follows:

- Of the total 354 contracts, 39 (11%) of them had no noticeable concerns; approximately nine (9) out of every 10 contracts have errors.
- 83 of the 354 (23%) did not have documentation regarding their official registration as a legal operating entity or have incorrect information.
- 162 of the 354 (45%) had the wrong rate listed for three year olds.
- 94 of the 354 (26%) had some other type of rate concern as well. These include wrong rates listed, Gold Seal listed for programs that are not Gold Seal, FCCH rate sheets used instead of Center rates, and providers approved rate being higher than their private pay rate.
- At least nine providers who either listed rates for ages they were not licensed to care for on their rates sheet or did not list a rate for a specific age group but had children of that age group enrolled.
- Exhibits not being completed correctly such as the wrong provider type being checked or insurance being marked in the wrong place, no signature authority giving the person who signed the contract authorization to do so, all age groups not having curriculum listed or unapproved curriculum being listed.

The family child care home review is nearing completion and these same issues are apparent. At the point this memo was written, the error rate is at least 85%.

The ELCHC staff and School District staff met on September 22, 2015 and agreed upon a timeframe for the issues to be resolved (see attached letter).

RECOMMENDATION:

Recognizing that our Coalition must be accountable to OEL as well as the children and families of Hillsborough County these issues highlight the need to look at opportunities to improve internal functions, utilize technology in seamless processes, and maximize the funds available for direct services to children and families. ELCHC staff will work with a Board Task force comprised to develop a plan to include (but not limited to) the following:

- Transfer contract functions to ELCHC;

- Examine opportunities to integrate and streamline processes; and
- Identify long-term cost saving strategies that will increase funds for high quality direct services and supports for children.



ISSUE:	School Readiness Services for School Age Children
FUNDING SOURCE:	School Readiness Funds

BACKGROUND: Background: During the FY 2013 session the Florida Legislature passed important early learning legislation. Language was included in that legislation (HB 7165) to establish state-wide eligibility priorities for the School Readiness Program. The legislative intent was to increase the number of children birth to kindergarten entry that were eligible to participate in the School Readiness Program. Section 1002.87 (1), Florida Statutes, lists the following nine priorities.

- Priority 1 – Children younger than age 13 whose parents receive temporary cash assistance and are subject to federal work requirements.
- Priority 2 – At-risk children younger than age 9.
- Priority 3 – Economically disadvantaged children until eligible to enter kindergarten. Their older siblings up to the age they are eligible to enter 6th grade may also be served.
- Priority 4 – Children from birth to kindergarten whose parents are transitioning from the temporary cash assistance work program to employment.
- Priority 5 – At-risk children who are at least age 9 but younger than 13. Those with siblings in priority groups 1-3 are higher priority than other children ages 9-13 in this priority group.
- Priority 6 – Economically disadvantaged children younger than 13. Priority in this category is given to children who have a younger sibling in the School Readiness Program under priority 3.
- Priority 7 – Children younger than 13 whose parents are transitioning from the temporary cash assistance work program to employment.
- Priority 8 – Children who have special needs and current individual educational plans from age 3 until they are eligible to enter kindergarten.
- Priority 9 – Children concurrently enrolled in the federal Head Start Program and VPK, regardless of priorities 1-4.

When the Early Learning Coalition of Hillsborough County began to implement the above priorities the Coalition was projecting a significant lapse of school readiness funds. As a result, the decision was made to enroll school-age siblings of children in Priority 3.

Currently 43.2% (4,014) of the children receiving funding through the School Readiness Program are school age children. It should be noted however, that 830 of the school age children are required to be served under Priorities 1 or 2. Currently, there are 3,184 Priority 3 children (low-income, employed families) birth to kindergarten entry on the waitlist for services.

Many coalitions have limited the enrollment of school age children in order to increase the number of children birth to 5 that are receiving services through the School Readiness Program. Since any changes to enrollment policy will have far reaching impact on families, staff is recommending that a taskforce of Board and other community stakeholders (e.g. United Way, Helios, Parks & Rec, etc.) be convened to develop a recommendation regarding this issue for presentation to the Board at its December meeting.

ISSUE: ELCHC FY14-15 Annual Report

BACKGROUND:

Section 1002.84(18), Florida Statutes, requires coalitions, by October 1 of each year, to submit an annual report to the Florida Office of Early Learning (OEL) that conforms to the format adopted by the office that includes nine specific components:

1. Segregation of school readiness program funds, Voluntary Prekindergarten Education Program funds, Child Care Executive Partnership Program Funds, and other local revenues available to the coalition.
2. Details of expenditures by fund source including total expenditures for administrative activities, quality activities, nondirect services and direct services for children.
3. Total number of Coalition staff and related expenditures for salaries and benefits. For any subcontracts, the total number of contracted staff and the related expenditures for salaries and benefits must be included.
4. The number of children served in the school readiness program, by provider type, enumerated by age and eligibility priority category, reported as the number of children served during the month, the average participation throughout the month, and the number of children served during the month.
5. The total number of children disenrolled during the year and the reasons for disenrollment.
6. The total number of providers by provider type.
7. A listing of any school readiness program provider, by type, whose eligibility to deliver the school readiness program is revoked, including a brief description of the state or federal violation that resulted in the revocation.
8. An evaluation of its direct enhancement services
9. The total number of children served in each provider facility.

The attached Annual Report for FY14-15 was submitted to OEL on Thursday, October 1, 2015 in the manner prescribed by OEL program guidance 202.80.

Evaluation of Direct Enhancement Services

COMPREHENSIVE CONSUMER EDUCATION

The foundation of the Coalition's comprehensive consumer education is Child Care Resource and Referral's (CCR&R) work with families. CCR&R assists families who combine work and family responsibilities in managing life transitions that include entry into the workforce, return to work, education or training, job changes, shift or schedule changes and family emergencies. As increasing numbers of families combine the roles of working and rearing children, child care becomes an important partner in helping parents manage their responsibilities. Finding, choosing, and beginning to use child care becomes one of the earliest and biggest challenges for the working parent.

Trained resource and referral specialists offer unbiased information and guidance to

families about child care options, provide information to help families identify quality early learning programs, suggest financial assistance strategies and provide referrals to other community programs as needed. If deemed eligible for School Readiness, families are counseled to select the type of care and provider that best meets the needs of the child in care as well as the family. There are no charges/fees associated with a provider listing in the Child Care Resource and Referral Database or for referral to the provider's program. The information reported about a provider's program is objective program information based on standards that are attainable for providers based on their type of care.

Additionally, Coalition VPK staff provides information to families about how to check VPK provider readiness rates, the structure of the VPK program as well as discussing other child care services available to support children's early learning.

FY 2015 Highlights:

- Responded to 4,868 families' request for information regarding child care arrangements for their children.
- Distributed 2,000 Quality Child Care Listing booklets to families and case managers to help foster families access programs that are Gold Seal Accredited and/or participate in the local Quality Rating Improvement System.

PROVIDER FINANCIAL SUPPORTS

The ELC of Hillsborough operates a comprehensive provider QRIS program entitled Quality Counts for Kids (QCFK). Providers participating in the QCFK program had access to training; technical assistance and coaching along with grant funds to support their programs' continuous quality improvement efforts. These funds, which are provided via a grant from the local Children's Services Council – The Children's Board of Hillsborough County, were used to purchase classroom materials, support staff wage incentives, and professional development activities to help programs increase the quality of services delivered to families. In order to apply for these support dollars, participating programs have to undergo a formal assessment and validation and then receive an official Quality Star Rating from the Coalition. Based on that validation and quality rating, programs subsequently develop and submit a Quality Action Plan. Upon approval of the action plan, programs submit an application for grant funds along with any required supporting documentation for items to be purchased with grant dollars. Once awarded grant dollars, programs must submit regular progress reports that are in alignment with their approved Quality Action Plan. For **FY14-15, 103 programs received \$256,400 in financial supports** to aid in improving the quality of their programs.

TRAINING AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

The ELC of Hillsborough partnered with the Early Childhood Council of Hillsborough County (ECC), University of South Florida Program Wide Positive Behavior Support, Champions for Children and Hillsborough County Public Schools-School Readiness Program to offer an extensive variety of trainings. Training information was distributed through the Coalition's training publication entitled The Bulletin. A total of eighty-nine (89) trainings were offered to 1,190 early childhood practitioners.

For a list and description of trainings offered to school readiness program providers, staff, and parents, *see Attachment A, pages 14-22*.

Coaching

Coalition staff provided coaching to support the implementation of Creative Curriculum to 24 classrooms serving children birth to 5 in six child care centers. Applicable pre and post CLASS Observations were conducted to determine individual teacher growth. In addition to the Creative Curriculum Pilot Project, Coalition staff offered coaching to 23 family child home providers and 88 classroom teachers to enhance global quality. The Coalition's contractor provided coaching to 95 practitioners to enhance global quality.

QUALITY ACTIVITIES FOR INFANTS & TODDLER CARE

Teaching staff for infants, toddlers and twos in six child care centers participated in the Creative Curriculum Pilot Project. Each practitioner completed 12 hours of training in the curriculum, 12 hours of training in Teaching Strategies GOLD as well as on-site coaching. The CLASS was used to measure growth. Nine of the 10 classrooms showed improvement.

Forty-four (44) infant, toddlers and twos teachers in Quality Counts for Kids (QCFK) centers and twenty-three (23) family child home providers serving this age group received extensive coaching on global quality. Pre and ITERS-R or FCCERS-R were conducted before coaching began and posts are conducted after at least six months of coaching.

MONITORING

Voluntary Prekindergarten Education Program (VPK) Monitoring:

In compliance with the State of Florida Statewide Voluntary Prekindergarten Provider Agreement (Form OEL-VPK 20, April 30, 2010), Coalition staff monitored a total of 349 private providers for VPK compliance during FY14-15. Each provider received a minimum of one (1) inspection per program type (school year/summer), which exceeds the State requirement. Additionally, 129 private providers received second and/or third re-inspection visits founded on a risk-based monitoring system developed by the Coalition.

The risk-based monitoring elements include:

- Documented non-compliance of instructor-child ratio or qualified staff on first inspection
- New providers or change of ownership
- Providers on probation (providers not meeting the kindergarten readiness rate)
- Providers on probation choosing to implement a Staff Development Plan (3 inspections)
- Provider who were the subject of a VPK complaint to the Coalition

The School District of Hillsborough monitored their own (55) approved sites.

INCLUSION

The Early Childhood Council of Hillsborough County (ECC) provides inclusion support services to providers and families in Hillsborough County. The local Warm Line is available to all child care centers and family child care homes as well as parents who request assistance regarding child care arrangements or concerns for their children with special needs. The goals of the Inclusion Initiative at ELCHC are:

1. To increase the number of providers who offer quality inclusive programs for children with disabilities and special health care needs.
2. To enhance the confidence, ability level, and education of caregivers who care for children with disabilities and special health care needs.
3. To assist providers and the families they serve in understanding and accessing the community resources and services available for children with disabilities and special health care needs.

4. To increase community awareness of the need for, requirements of, and benefits associated with inclusive child care for children with disabilities and special health care needs.

ECC Inclusion Services Program offers trainings on a variety of issues, including health, child development, environmental adaptations, curriculum, and laws and regulations. During FY14-15, ECC reports the following activities:









ATTACHMENT A – Trainings by Topic Area (includes brief description)

Age Appropriate Discipline

Biting, Scratching, Tantrums, Oh My!

Participants will gain knowledge about why toddlers engage in biting, scratching, tantrums, and other problem behaviors. In addition, participants will also learn how to respond to these challenging behaviors, understand the behaviors, and develop strategies to support children experiencing these behaviors.

Clarifying Expectations and Rules to Promote On-Task Behavior and Engagement

Much success can happen throughout the year with children birth to five years old, when time is taken at the beginning of the school year to teach rules and clarify expectations/directions. Participants will learn fun and easy lessons to incorporate into their daily routines. A portion of this session will involve make-and-take activities, so that providers can implement ideas the next day in their classrooms.

Feelings Book Nook Make-and-Take

Teaching young children through stories is a fun and age-appropriate way to teach feeling vocabulary. During this make-and-take workshop, we will discuss several children's books and participants will receive lesson plan ideas to help teach understanding, identifying, and self-regulating emotions. A raffle will also be provided and a few participants will receive materials for their classrooms.

Positive Behavior Support, Part 1A and 1B

Through these training participants learn the importance of building relationships with children and families and how to create supportive environments through room design, schedules and routines. Part two teaches how to recognize teachable moments relating to social emotional behavior, why rules are important, and how to develop them in children thru the use of literature. Participants understand the importance of problem solving and the need for children to control their anger and handle their disappointment.

Teaching Tools for Young Children: TTYC Toolkit

This toolkit is full of strategies to prevent challenging behavior, teach new skills, and respond in a way that promotes active engagement. A Routine Based Support Guide and CD of reproducible materials will be distributed.

Using Technology to Create Fun Visual Supports and Scripted Stories

In this session, participants will learn how to create fun interactive visuals and scripted stories to teach toddlers and preschoolers social-emotional skills and how to follow directions. Participants are asked to bring a laptop to the training, if possible. We encourage participants who bring their own laptops to have Microsoft Office on their computer. Presenters will bring extra laptops for participants to use in groups of three.

What Do You Do with the Mad that you Feel

Teachers will learn strategies to help children understand their feelings and appropriate ways to deal with them.

Character Development

Infant/Toddler: Responsive Routines, Environment, and Social-Emotional Supports

This session addresses strategies for developing routines and environments to support infants and toddlers social-emotional development. Participants will learn about intentionally supporting children through the physical environment, positive interactions and emotional literacy. This session will involve making and taking materials to use in infant/toddler classrooms. A raffle will also be provided and a few participants will receive materials for their classrooms.

Peace Making Skills for Little Kids

Teachers will learn hands-on activities for children to help children develop skills and find creative and non-destructive ways to settle conflicts and live in harmony with themselves and others

Social Emotional Literacy for Infants, Toddlers, and Twos

Teachers will learn that books are a fun way to engage children and to be more intentional about supporting and teaching social emotional development.

Computer Technology

How to Format a Handbook in Word

In this hands-on workshop, you'll learn how to add, move through, and edit text; change the size or appearance of text; change margins; align text; spelling check; save, etc. so that you can focus on the content of the handbook and not struggle with the formatting.

Internet Basics for Child Care Providers

Computer internet basics for child care providers. How to search and use the internet to find child care resources and web sites.

Developmentally Appropriate Curriculum

2nd Annual Back to School Bash!

Jumpstart your school year with a day of networking with colleagues, exploring a wide variety of ideas to add to your teaching toolkit, all while creating some new resources. Don't forget to bring your camera!

Activities I

This session will look at best practices for setting up and maintaining the following activities/centers in a preschool classroom: fine motor, art, music/movement, blocks and sand/water play. The ECERS-R will be referenced as a guide.

Activities II

This session will look at best practices for setting up and maintaining the following activities/centers in a preschool classroom: dramatic play, nature/science, math/number, TV/video/computers, and promoting diversity. The ECERS-R will be referenced as a guide.

Algebra in Preschool? Yes!

Algebraic thinking includes recognizing and analyzing patterns, studying and representing relationships, making generalizations, and analyzing how things change. Come discover strategies and activities to help young children develop their algebraic thinking skills to help their future match success.

Appropriate Practice for Preschool Day

This training focuses on a developmentally appropriate curriculum model for preschool children. The sessions provide an understanding of developmental theory hands on approach. All participants will learn the importance of structuring the play environment for preschool children. The session titles are: Adult-Child Interactions, Daily Routine and Learning Environment, and multiple Intelligences and Active Learning.

Be a Transition Magician

Without transition tips and tricks, the time it takes to get children from one activity to another can feel like a ticking time bomb. In this session, we will share a packet of "magic" filled with transition strategies that will prevent challenging behavior and help kids move from one activity to the next.

Creative Curriculum for Infants, Toddlers and Twos

During this two-day training participants will explore the three volumes of the Creative Curriculum for Infants, Toddlers and Twos in order to understand the importance of responsive care and to learn how to incorporate the 38 research-based objectives for development and learning in order to focus on what matters most for young children.

Creative Curriculum for Preschool

During this two-day training participants will explore the five volumes of the Creative Curriculum for Preschool in order to understand the importance of responsive care and to learn how to incorporate the 38 research-based objectives for development and learning in order to focus on what matters most for young children.

Does My Family Child Care Home Have to Look Like a Center? Creating Quality Early Childhood Learning Environments in Family Child Care Homes

Training participants will become familiar with some components of a quality early childhood environment and how to incorporate that atmosphere and those practices within in a family child care home setting. This training will support your plans for quality improvement and are consistent with the FCCERS-R quality standards.

Dual Language Learners

Learn to work with English language learners while embracing their families and cultural; understand second language acquisition, how to work with children in the classroom and the importance of supporting home language.

Early Childhood Symposium for Infant & Toddler

Teachers will attend 4 sessions learning hands On activities for Literacy, Science, Social Emotional and How to use the ILP (Yellow Sheet)

Early Childhood Symposium for Preschool Teachers

Training will consist of three sessions that will include new strategies for use in the preschool classroom. Sessions shall be strategies to start the year off right [The Fabulous First 30 Days], Strategies for conducting read-alouds and shared reading techniques [Rockin? Reading Strategies] and how to use complete the ASQ-ILP [What Do I Do With That Yellow Sheet? (ASQ-ILP)].

Explore, Discover and Learn through Science

Real Science begins with childhood curiosity, which leads to discovery and exploration with teacher help and encouragement. Participants will leave with hands- on activities that will help develop skills across all domains through the integration of science.

Family Child Care Home DACA

In this 3 day training, Family Child Care Home Providers will learn about the importance of building relationships with children and families, how to appropriately set up the learning environment with a daily routine and how to plan and implement appropriate activities.

First Steps for Infants and Toddlers

A training utilizing brain research and practical experiences to build a foundation of appropriate and effective infant toddler caregiver interactions, to apply knowledge of indoor and outdoor environmental planning strategies and to effectively utilize your curriculum to develop infant toddlers lesson plans and instructional assessments.

Fun with Sensory Play

Participants will learn about fun and safe sensory activities to conduct with preschoolers (3-4 year-olds). They will also explore different homemade sensory materials that they will be able to make and use in their classrooms.

Fun with Transitions

Participants will learn fun and upbeat transition activities to use with different age groups. The training will keep everyone moving and engaged from beginning to end.

Geometry and Spatial Relations: The Shape of Things to Come

Rhyming text and colorful book illustrations reveal how simple shapes come together to form houses, boats and other objects in this world. Children will likely begin to identify shapes in everything around them after enjoying this book.

How to Succeed with Dual Language Learners

This course has been design for teachers of three and four year olds. It gives the participants a background in Dual English Learners, teaching strategies to benefit children, the roles of the teacher and the family, and the use of assessment in meeting children's need.

I'm Bored! Creating Interesting Outdoor Spaces

This workshop will look at outdoor playscapes and give the participants different ideas - food for thought - to enhance outdoor spaces.

Inside, Outside, Let's Go Play

Engaging children in play during both center time and playground time is a wonderful opportunity to target teaching friendship skills. We will discuss ways to promote interactions between children, how to be creative with materials, and how to implement strategies the decrease challenges.

It's More Than Just Talking

Teachers will learn how to expand language and reasoning through the content areas.

Lesson Planning for All Teachers

Teachers will learn how to write developmentally appropriate lesson plans and how to use the new Florida State Standards to assess children.

Lesson Planning for Infants, Toddlers, and Twos Teachers

Teachers will learn how to use the Florida Early Learning and Developmental Standards Birth to Five Years to know the strengths and needs of their children and support them through writing developmentally appropriate lesson plans.

Lesson Planning for Preschool Teachers

Teachers will learn how to use the Florida Early Learning and Developmental Standards (2010) Birth to Five Years to know the strengths and needs of their children and support them through writing developmentally appropriate lesson plans.

Let's Shine at Circle Time

Circle time doesn't actually have to look like a circle at all. In this session we will discuss developmentally appropriate activities and expectations for group time in infant, toddler, and preschool classrooms. Participants will have the opportunity to watch videos of group time in action and reflect on their own group time to lesson plan for the future. A raffle will also be provided and a few participants will receive materials for use in their group time.

Onset, Rhyme, Alphabet Time and Writing, Too!

Teachers will learn developmentally appropriate activities for preschool children that will help with later success in Kindergarten.

Pre-Schoolers PLAY too!

Teachers will learn the importance of Developmentally Appropriate learning environments that promotes learning through play in the preschool classroom.

Ready, Set, PLAY

Teachers will learn the importance of Developmentally Appropriate learning environments that stimulate brain development in infants, toddlers and twos.

This workshop will discuss how children develop logical reasoning skills and how to integrate activities that practice these skills into your routines transitions and small group activities.

CARA's Kit is designed for teachers who are involved in providing early care and education for preschool children, particularly those with developmental differences. The kit provides linkages to Pre-K Learning Standards and curricula, and provides a matrix of adaptations that can benefit all children. This training is co-sponsored by Inclusion Support Services and the Early Learning Coalition for VPK teachers and programs participating in Quality Counts for Kids.

CARA's Kit for Toddlers: Creating Adaptation for Routines and Activities

CARAs Kit is designed for teachers who are involved in providing early care and education for toddlers, particularly those with developmental differences. The kit provides linkages to Learning Standards and curricula, and provides a matrix of adaptations that can benefit all children. This is a great training for those who have already attended the CARAs Kit for Preschoolers!

Inclusion and Resources for Children with Special Needs

This training will provide an overview of inclusion and what it looks like in early childhood classrooms. Participants will also learn how to access resources to support children and families with special needs in our community.

Recognizing and Reducing Stress in Childcare

In this workshop participants will reflect on the some of the stressors they may experience as an early childhood educator. Participants will be able to recognize their own stress, identify causes of their stress, demonstrate strategies to prevent, manage, and relieve their stress. In addition, participants will also be able to identify stressors for the children they serve by recognizing stress, causes of stress, and coping skills.

The Invisible Suitcase: Looking into Johnny's Behavior

Participants will become aware of possible trauma(s) a child/children may have experienced in early childhood. They will learn about the effects of those traumas on childrens behavior. Join us to learn about the importance of creating a safe environment, secure relationships, and providing coping skill to young children who have experienced trauma.

It describes the ASQ 3rd Edition, and offers practice completing and scoring the ASQ-3 in accordance with Law 7165. In addition, information will be provided regarding the Early Learning Coalition Hillsborough County mandate on submitting and maintaining completed ASQ's, as well as your partnership with the School Readiness Screening & Assessment team.

Creative Curriculum Teaching Strategies Gold

This is a two-part training. Part two was offered on 10/25/14 from 9:00am- 3:30 pm and 11/03/14 from 12:00pm-6:30 pm.

Building Nurturing and Responsive Relationships with Children & Families

Building nurturing and responsive relationships is a fundamental building block when teaching young children and teaming with their families. In this session, providers will learn some creative ways to build bonds between caregivers and children. In addition, we will have rich discussion and do activities to promote family involvement and engagement to foster social-emotional growth.

It's More Than Words: Fostering Positive and Nurturing Interactions in the Preschool Classroom

This workshop will assist providers of preschool children to understand best practices when interacting with young children. This workshop will also be beneficial to those working with the ECERS-R in their classrooms.

Making the Most of Classroom Interactions (MMCI)

MMCI helps early childhood professionals engage with the Classroom Assessment Scoring System (CLASS) as they identify and understand the interactions that increase children's learning and development. Participants will: examine the impact of teacher-child interactions and relationships on children's learning, identify teacher- child interactions that affect child outcomes, and learn how to use the CLASS observation tool for considering teaching practices and guiding observations of classroom videos and real-life interactions.

Responsive Adult - Child Interactions with Infant and Toddlers

Participants will understand how their relationships impact the well being of infants and toddlers and be able to describe responsible care giving in all areas of the day. Participants learn how to increase language development using literacy with infants and toddlers.



County-Wide Demographics as of October 5, 2015


Number of Programs by Type of Facility


Capacity by Program Type


SR Wait List Children by Care Level


SR Waiting List Children by Priority

VPK Enrollments by Program Type



Glazer Children’s Museum Annual Imagination Gala

ELCHC staff and Board members attended the Glazer Children’s Museum Annual Imagination Gala on Friday, September 25 at the Glazer Children’s Museum. The annual event highlights the Museum’s yearly accomplishments and serves as a fundraiser to support the continued programming and exhibits. The event allowed staff and Board members to network with other local non-profit agencies and early childhood advocates to discuss and promote ELCHC programs and initiatives.



Glazer Children’s Museum 5th Annual Birthday Bash Event

On Sunday, June 20, 2015 staff manned a table at the 5th Annual Birthday Bash at the Glazer Children’s Museum. Each year during its birthday celebration event, the Glazer opens its doors free of charge. ELCHC was asked to participate as a valued community partner during this important celebration. Staff distributed information on all ELCHC programs and initiatives and assisted parents with general early childhood care and education questions. Approximately 3,000 people attended the day’s events.

Toddler Take Over with the Glazer Children’s Museum

Toddler Takeover was a parent engagement event held at the Glazer Children’s Museum from Monday, August 17 – Friday, August 28, 2015. The two-week event, which was sponsored in whole by the Early Learning Coalition of Hillsborough County, delivered targeted early childhood programming to area parents and their children that focused on early emotional and social development, gross and fine motor skill development, sign language, music and dance.



Approximately 45 sessions were delivered during *Toddler Takeover* (as part of regular admission at the Glazer) by local early childhood experts and professionals from multiple community partner agencies and programs: Champions for Children, Parents as Teachers, Early Childhood Council of Hillsborough County (ECC), USF Positive Wide, ELCHC Quality Counts for Kids, and Glazer Children’s Museum Educational staff.

Due to overall combined promotional efforts put forth by both the Glazer Children’s Museum, the Coalition and partnering entities, the event received heavy promotion (*website posts, social media posts and shares, print articles in newsletters and area print publications, e-mail blasts and flyers*) which, in combination with the quality programming, resulted in an attendance of 7,219 – a 59% increase from last year’s Toddler Takeover event.

ELCHC Web Redesign Request for Proposal Process

The Coalition received a total of 4 proposals by the submission deadline. Of those 4 proposals, 3 were submitted as required. One proposal was disqualified for incomplete submission and was therefore not reviewed by the RFP Review team.

During the proposers’ writing period, staff assembled a volunteer RFP Review Team composed of

representatives of ELCHC's core 'audiences'. Board Member – Dr. Shawn Robinson, Child Care Provider – Terry Fernandez, Community Partner – Amy Haile, Parent – Rick Lence and Staff – Tracie T. White. All members of the RFP Review Team received the full RFP, original copies of all submitted proposals and the Written Question and Answer documents as well as rating sheets for each proposal. The team entered into the formal RFP review period on Monday, August 31, 2015 and concluded their evaluations and ratings on Friday, September 4, 2015 as scheduled. At its final meeting, the RFP Review Team concluded that only one proposal, submitted by a firm called Sparxoo, scored high enough to warrant a final presentation to the team.

On September 15, 2015 at 9:30 am a team representing Sparxoo presented to the RFP Review Team offering an opportunity for the team to ask questions and gain additional clarifications about the qualifications of the firm and their proposal. At the conclusion of the Sparxoo presentation the RFP team confirmed their earlier scores and agreed that Sparxoo was the best firm to satisfy the terms and the vision of the ELCHC as outlined in the RFP.

In order to remain on the tight timeline for a site launch date of January 4, 2015 staff will need to execute a contract for an amount not to exceed \$50,000 with Sparxoo in order to have a project start date of October 1, 2015. This amount was allocated in the FY2015-16 Budget that was approved by the ELCHC Board of Directors at its regular meeting held on Monday, June 8, 2015.

On September 23, 2015, the ELCHC Executive/Finance Committee held a Special Meeting to approve staff executing a contract with Sparxoo as the procured vendor for the ELCHC Web Site Redesign. Staff began officially working with the selected vendor on Monday, October 5, 2015.

Provider Elections for Private Child Care Representative

On April 20, 2015 Sally Harris officially resigned her seat on the Early Learning Coalition of Hillsborough County's Board of Directors as the Private Child Care Provider Representative. This Board seat is considered a 'Designated Director' and per the Coalition's historical preference, the representative that occupies this seat must be elected by a vote of his/her constituents.

In order to fill the vacant seat, Communications staff developed and launched an election process to fill the seat. The official process began on July 15, 2015 when the nominations phase of the process commenced. Providers were given until Friday, August 28, 2015 at 3 pm to submit nomination forms that asked each candidate to state their professional skills and background as well as deliver a personal statement regarding their desire to serve on the Board as a representative of the private child care community in Hillsborough. The nomination phase produced five candidates whose applications were made public on the ELCHC website for review and consideration by the provider community.

The voting phase of the election process began on Tuesday, September 1, 2015 at 8:00 am and closed on Friday, September 25, 2015 at 4:00 pm. A total of 303 votes were cast. The election was by plurality vote with final results indicating that provider Mary Hancock of Merry Go Round child care center as the choice of the provider community. The results of the election will become official upon ratification of the ELCHC Board of Directors at their regular meeting scheduled for Tuesday, October 13, 2015.

ReadyRosie

Staff and Board members have continued to distribute ReadyRosie collateral throughout Hillsborough County. Staff has continued to do community presentations to large groups regarding ReadyRosie and community partners are supporting ReadyRosie on their websites and print materials (*see attachments*) Highlights of ReadyRosie outreach efforts have been a mailing to all School District Elementary Schools asking for their support of ReadyRosie. Each school was provided with ReadyRosie posters and samples

of brochures and touch cards. Staff has also been offering to partner agencies the option of 'gifting' ReadyRosie to their clients as part of their parent engagement efforts. Overall ReadyRosie stats are as follows:

Tampa Bay Kids Expo

The purpose of the event is to share information regarding safety, health and wellness, education, child care and other important family and child topics. The event was filled with exhibits, educational displays, a family entertainment stage and interactive activity zones. Activities included health screenings, face painting, crafts, bounce houses, magic shows, balloon art and live entertainment.

The Expo, which is targeted to children of all ages, is regional in its promotion, has no admission fees and had a projected attendance of +3,000.

Mr. Ivery noted that these factors plus many discussions with residents and community leaders influenced the decision to build the Sulphur Springs Resource Center (see related article in this newsletter).

In addition to the Resource Center, United Way Suncoast funds other key services in Sulphur Springs including many of the After School Programs at the YMCA and activities at the Boys and Girls Club.

The United Way Suncoast provides a regional framework for community change and works to break the cycle of generational poverty. United Way Suncoast serves Hillsborough, Pinellas, Sarasota and DeSoto Counties and in 2014, they raised \$22.6 million for use in the Suncoast region. 
