CALL TO ORDER

Noting that a quorum had been established, Chair Patel called the meeting to order at 5:34 pm.

Chair Patel introduced and welcomed new Board members, Dr. Daphne Fudge & Liz Welch to the Early Learning Coalition of Hillsborough County.

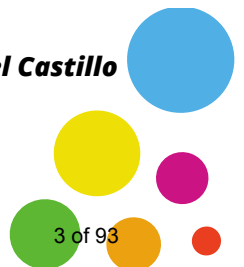

Robert Buesing made a motion to approve the items on the Consent Agenda. Carlos Del Castillo made a second. The motion carried unanimously.



EXECUTIVE REPORTS

Board Chair's Report

Chair Patel reported on the following items:

- Chair Patel delivered highlights of the Build Conference that he and members of staff attended on July 12-14, 2016 in New Orleans. Chair Patel was able to meet state, national, and foreign leaders of early learning while at the conference.
- Chair Patel and Dr. Mary Harper attended a Board meeting at the Early Learning Coalition of Miami Dade to observe how Miami Dade conducts their Board meetings. They also visited Miami Dade's call center, discussed branding initiatives, and ways to collaborate.
- Chair Patel shared with Board members that the Early Learning Advisory Council (ELAC) does not have a surplus in their budget for this fiscal year and the Children's Movement has made School Readiness a legislative priority for the 2020 platform.
- Chair Patel stated that the Early Learning Advisory Council meeting will be held in Tampa on October 7, 2016.
- Chair Patel informed Board members that a reception would be held on the evening of October 6, 2016 at the Sheraton Suites, Tampa Airport Westshore for the ELAC, ELCHC Board of Directors, and stakeholders. The goal of the reception would be to introduce the new ELCHC Chief Executive Officer.
- Chair Patel stated Dr. Rahul Mehra resigned, which would open one private sector seat on the ELCHC Board of Directors.
- Chair Patel informed membership that Board orientation would be Monday, September 12, 2016 at 5:30 pm, the next Board meeting would be October 10, 2016 at 5:30 pm, and the Board Retreat would be changed from November 7, 2016 to November 14, 2016 from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm.
- Chair Patel reminded Board members to submit their FY 2016-2017 Conflict of Interest, Related Party Declaration and Disclosure, and Code of Ethics forms to Kelley Minney as soon as possible.
- Chair Patel congratulated Commissioner Sandra Murman for being designated as Child Advocate of the Year by Florida's Children First.

Chair Patel appointed Board members to the following Committees:

1. **Service Delivery and Efficiency Committee:**
Angela Chowning, Chair, Dr. Daphne Fudge, Liz Welch, Dr. Jacquelyn Jenkins, and Mary Hancock. Dr. Mary Harper and Karen Perkins assigned as staff liaisons.
2. **Space/Lease Committee:**
Aakash Patel, Chair, Carlos Del Castillo, Brian McEwen, Luke Buzard, and Jill Hammond. Steve Costner assigned as staff liaison. The intended purpose of the Space/Lease Committee is to discuss relocation options for the Tampa Bay Institute of Early Childhood Professionals.
3. **Legislative Committee:**
Sandra Murman, Chair, Edward Peachey, Dr. Douglas Holt, and Tracye Brown. Bobbi Davis assigned as staff legislative liaison. The intended purpose of the Legislative Committee is to prepare for Hillsborough Day at the Capitol.

Interim CEO Report

Karen Perkins reported on the following items:

- Ms. Perkins reminded Board members that they must complete and submit the Form 8B Memorandum when they abstain from voting during a Board meeting.
- Ms. Perkins introduced Abigail Perez, Family Services Coordinator.
- Ms. Perkins reported that the School Readiness provider contracts were due by June 30, 2016 and the ELCHC received over 800 contracts. The Provider Services staff have answered over 600 phone calls from VPK families, April to June, and was able to provide those families support and direction. Ms. Perkins stated there had been positive feedback about the Provider Portal. The Portal has been beneficial to the providers in helping with the application process.
- Ms. Perkins stated that school would start during the week and Family Services would be busy issuing VPK certificates.
- Ms. Perkins reported that Dr. Mary Harper, Bobbie Huard, Theon Salley, and Hannah Goble presented at One Goal Conference, which was held on June 20-22, 2016, in Tampa.
- Ms. Perkins stated that two of the ELCHC staff members had been invited to present at the National Association of Education of Young Children Annual Conference held in Los Angeles, California.
- Ms. Perkins informed the Board of the auto-termination of 8,575 VPK children was a large hurdle and one that slowed down the reimbursement process but did not delay payment to VPK providers. The Office of Early Learning was able to recover the data and the School District has revised their procedures to prevent auto-termination of VPK children in the future.

Mary Hancock requested that emails through MIP for VPK payments display ELCHC in the subject line to help providers make the connection. Steve Costner indicated that such change would be implemented as soon as possible.

Board Attorney-Sunshine Law Review

Board attorney, Steve Lee, reviewed and discussed Florida's Government-in-the-Sunshine Law. Mr. Lee stated the intended purpose of the Sunshine Law is to cover the decision making process of public bodies such as Coalitions, County Commissions, or City Commissions. The public bodies are supposed to be as transparent as possible and all deliberations, discussions, and decisions are to be made at publicly noticed meetings, that the public can attend, at which minutes are kept. Mr. Lee reminded board members that they are prohibited from discussing Coalition business with each other outside of a publicly noticed meeting. He added that Board members who discuss Coalition business outside of a publicly noticed meeting would be in violation of the Sunshine Law, that which could void any business done by the Coalition in regards to that particular matter, and that those Board members who are in violation of the Sunshine Law would be subjected to criminal penalties. COMMITTEE REPORTS

Executive/Finance Committee

Chair Patel stated that the Executive/Finance Committee approved the contract for Young Search Partners, LLC and that the Search Firm would be actively seeking the new ELCHC Chief Executive Officer. Chair Patel mentioned that the Committee recommended a slate of officers for the Board to vote on.

Governance Committee

Dr. Shawn Robinson stated that the Governance Committee reviewed the Bylaw revisions, which were approved under the Consent portion of the agenda, and reminded Board members to complete and submit their annual forms.

Communications & Outreach Committee- Vision 2020

Dianne Jacob discussed the Town Hall meeting for child care Providers that was held on July 29, 2016. Approximately 80 providers attended the Town Hall and received resource information, training information, educational information and promotional materials. Ms. Jacob stated the intent of the Town Hall was to provide an opportunity for Providers to network, voice concerns, and receive the resources they would need to improve the quality of their centers.

Ms. Jacob reported that the Communications & Outreach Committee revisited the selection of the new ELCHC logo at the request of the Board. Ms. Jacobs stated that Board members participated in a webinar on June 27, 2016 which offered clarification as to how and why the consultants arrived at the recommended logo. A survey was sent to the Board members requesting their confirmation of the recommended logo and 12 out of 24 members responded. Ms. Jacobs stated that based on the outcomes of the webinar survey the Committee is moving forward with the development of the deliverables outlined in the RFP.

Tracie White reviewed all deliverables in the RFP that were satisfied and talked about the consultant's recommendations for the ELCHC tagline. Tracie stated that Sparxzoo delivered a training presentation to ELCHC staff on July 20, 2016 regarding the new logo, the meaning behind the logo, and how staff would help to roll out the new logo to the public. Tracie stated the new logo was revealed at the Back to School Bash on August 6, 2016 on banners, table covers, and some literature.

Dianne Jacob recounted the outreach efforts of the staff.

ACTION ITEMS

Election of Board Officers

Chair Patel presented the slate of candidates for ELCHC Board Officers. Chair Patel indicated that all candidates had agreed to remain in their current roles as Board Officers on the ELCHC Board of Directors.

Approval of New ELCHC Tagline

The new ELCHC tagline, *Potential Starts Here*, was moved forward for vote.

Luke Buzard made a motion to, as approved by the Communications Committee, to have the official ELCHC tagline as Potential Starts Here. Angela Chowning seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

OLD BUSINESS

Child Care Development Fund

Dr. Mary Harper delivered a presentation about the Child Care Development Fund (CCDF) entitled *The Effects of the Re-Authorization of CCDBG*. Dr. Harper highlighted there would be key changes that the Coalition would have to implement and that those changes would have an impact on quality initiatives, and other areas such as: licensing, LiveScan, eligibility, waitlists, and contracts.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

Enhanced Field System (EFS) Server Solutions

Steve Costner discussed the Enhanced Field System (EFS) Server, which is required by the State of Florida and used by Coalitions statewide to administer the School Readiness and VPK programs. In Hillsborough County, the EFS database sits on a physical server that is housed and maintained by the School District of Hillsborough County (SDHC). Mr. Costner stated the database had been slow and had recently experienced data backup issues. Mr. Costner presented two potential solutions for the Boards consideration and discussion:

- Option 1. Migrate EFS database to Tallahassee to the Northwest Data center, which is a well - established center. This would give OEL the ability to maintain the database for Coalitions. 17 coalitions have made the switch to Tallahassee. There would be no cost to migrate the system but there may be a cost to the Coalition associated with upgrading equipment at the school district.
- Option 2. Migrate the database to Dale Mabry offices and staff would be responsible for updating the database for School readiness and VPK programs.

Mr. Costner requested permission from the Board to conduct more research on the cost and timeframe of the transition of the EFS Server to be brought back to the Board at the October board meeting.

Unlicensed Child Care

Angela Chowning of Child Care Licensing discussed the challenges of regulating unlicensed child care facilities and family child care homes. Ms. Chowning stated that In Fiscal Year 2015-2016 there were 318 complaints from the public and 45 allegations of unlicensed child care providers.

Ms. Chowning stated that Child Care Licensing would continue to identify solutions that would help their efforts to regulate unlicensed Child Care Facilities and Child Care Homes.

Karen Perkins shared a letter from a provider thanking the Early Learning Coalition of Hillsborough County and the Children's Board for all the years of funding and all the accomplishments the funding supported.

Board Retreat

Chair Patel stated the Board Retreat would be November 14, 2016 from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm. Chair Patel expressed that the Retreat would provide an opportunity for Board members to get to know one another and set goals for FY 2016-2017. Chair Patel requested Board members email Karen Perkins with discussion topics they would like to discuss at the Retreat.

RECOMMENDED ACTION:	Authorize staff to enter into a contract with Champions for Children

Background:

In 2012, the Early Learning Coalition of Hillsborough County collaborated with Champions for Children and other local agencies to develop a response to the Children's Board of Hillsborough County's Request for Proposals. The Quality Counts for Kids program was one of thirty-three (33) proposals recommended for funding. The Coalition's original agreement included other subcontracted partners, however, the FY 2016-17 Children's Board contract includes Champions for Children as the lone subcontracted provider. Champions for Children will provide direct supports to families with children attending the early care and education sites served through Quality Counts for Kids. Their focus is assisting families using the evidence-based "READY! for Kindergarten" program to build the success of their children and readiness for kindergarten.

As the lead agency for the Quality Counts for Kids program the Coalition is responsible for the execution of contracts with the partner agencies. Once the Coalition's contract is fully executed by the Children's Board, the Coalition will execute the subcontract with Champions for Children.

Staff recommends that the Board authorize staff to enter into a contract with Champions for Children for their program components.

ISSUE:	Execute Contract Amendment One to School Readiness Contract with School District of Hillsborough County
FISCAL IMPACT:	\$1,373,668.93
FUNDING SOURCE:	Office of Early Learning
RECOMMENDED ACTION:	Authorize staff to execute a contract amendment with the School Board of Hillsborough County in the amount of \$1,373,668.93 for the period October 1, 2016 to June 30, 2017.

Background:

The Office of Early Learning has allocated the Coalition funding for the Performance Funding Project and Contracted Slots for the period October 1, 2016 – June 30, 2017. This additional funding has been supplied to Coalitions as part of the new CCDF requirements and does not reduce any of the current funds designated for child care direct services.

The Performance Funding Project (PFP) funds of up to \$626,855, are Quality Services funds allocated to eligible providers, including a portion in located in high poverty census tracts according to criteria established by the Office of Early Learning.

The Contracted Slots funds of up to \$746,813.93, are designated to providers in high poverty zip codes that meet criteria including: current School Readiness provider in good standing and in compliance with the terms and conditions of its contract with the Coalition; have no Class I licensing violations and no more than three Class II licensing violations between April 1, 2014 and the contract execution date; and at least 50% of selected providers must be Performance Funding Project participants, while the others selected are participating in the Coalition's Quality Counts for Kids. Contracted Slots should assist in maintaining continuity of care for families and their children.

The full list of sites for both the Performance Funding Project and Contracted Slots is attached.

The Coalition will provide the School Board of Hillsborough County specific details regarding the distribution of this funding consistent with the Office of Early Learning guidelines.

Staff recommends that the Board authorize staff to enter into a contract amendment with the School District of Hillsborough County.

BACKGROUND:

The Board of Directors, via conference call on September 1, 2016, approved the appointment of Stephen Knobl as Chief Executive Officer of the Early Learning Coalition of Hillsborough County. If approved, the accompanying employment contract stipulates terms and conditions to which the Chief Executive Officer will be subject.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into as of September 1, 2016, by and between the Hillsborough County School Readiness Coalition, Inc., D/B/A Early Learning Coalition of Hillsborough County, Inc., a nonprofit corporation operating in the State of Florida (hereafter "Coalition" or "ELCHC") and Stephen Knobl (hereafter "Executive" or "Executive Director"). The Coalition hereby employs the Executive, and the Executive hereby accepts employment on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth.

1. Term of Employment

The initial term of this Agreement shall commence on September 12, 2016, and end on June 30, 2017. Thereafter the Agreement shall automatically renew for periods of one year each unless either party provides written notice on or before the first day of April that the Agreement will not be automatically renewed. This Agreement is subject to earlier termination as provided in Section 9 hereof.

2. Duties

The Executive shall perform the usual and customary duties associated with the position of Executive Director of an Early Learning Coalition as defined in the Coalition's job description of this position. These duties include, but are not limited to: oversight and staffing of all employment positions of the Coalition, facilitating and assisting the Board of Directors of the Coalition (hereafter "Board") in their policy making, planning and oversight of the Coalition, planning and governance of the day to day activities of the Coalition, oversee and be responsible for Coalition marketing and public relations and serve as the spokesperson for the Coalition to promote early learning issues to the public, and such other duties as may be prescribed for the Executive Director by the Board or the Executive Committee. The Executive Director will devote his full working time and best efforts to advance the interests of the Coalition in furtherance of policies established by the Board. The Executive reports to the Board or to the Executive Committee when either is in session; otherwise the Executive reports to the appointed Chair of the Board. The Executive is the employed Executive Director of the Coalition with full authority for the management of its affairs subject only to the duties specified by the bylaws, state laws, other governing documents and this agreement. The Executive has sole and exclusive authority for the engagement and discharge of all other employees of the Coalition.

3. Compensation

During the term of this Agreement, the Coalition shall pay the Executive Director a base salary of one hundred thirty-five thousand dollars (\$135,000.00) per year, payable bi-weekly and subject to payroll deductions as may be necessary or customary for the Coalition's salaried employees. Any increase in base salary must be approved by the Board. This compensation plus benefits payable pursuant to paragraph 5 below, paid time off in accordance with paragraph 6 below and payment of expenses in accordance with paragraph 8 below constitutes the entire payment by the Coalition for the services of the Executive. Except as provided for by this Agreement, no other or additional compensation in any form will be considered or paid for the period of this Agreement unless voted upon by the Board specifically for the Executive. Nothing in this Agreement shall preclude the Executive from receiving stipends from third parties for consulting, conducting workshops, retreats or lectures if performed during paid time off and at his own expense, so long as such activities do not interfere or conflict with the duties as Executive Director as determined by the Executive Committee.

4. ELCHC Policies

Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to modify, alter or conflict with the ELCHC Bylaws. In the event of a conflict between the ELCHC Personnel Policies and the terms of this agreement, the terms of this agreement shall prevail. The intent of the parties is that the relationship between the Executive Director and the Coalition will be governed by the Bylaws, the terms of this agreement and, except to the extent of a conflict, ELCHC's Personnel Policies.

5. Benefits

The Coalition shall provide the Executive Director with health insurance or compensation for health insurance and the other benefits available to all salaried employees of the Coalition, including payments made pursuant to the profit sharing plan and contributions to a 401(k) account. The Coalition reserves the right to modify, amend or terminate employee benefits, but with recommendations as to budgetary objectives from the Executive Director.

6. Paid Time Off (PTO)

The Executive Director shall earn paid time off in accordance with Coalition policies applicable to all employees. The Executive Director may accrue a maximum of three hundred (300) hours of unused PTO. Upon termination of this Agreement the Executive Director will be eligible for payout of accrued PTO up to a maximum of 300 hours.

7. Performance Evaluation

The Executive Committee of the Coalition shall review the Executive Director's performance annually and may consider whether an increase in base salary is appropriate. The Executive Director acknowledges his receipt and review of the documents containing the Coalition's performance review process and criteria.

8. Expenses

The Coalition shall underwrite or reimburse the Executive Director for all reasonable expenses incurred in connection with the Coalition's activities as allowed by Coalition policy, Office of Early Learning Policy or State Statute. Subject to budget constraints, the Coalition shall provide a reasonable allowance for the Executive's attendance at continuing education conferences.

9. Termination of Employment

The term of employment under this Agreement is subject to early termination in accordance with this Section. Subject to paragraph 6 above, all accrued PTO will be paid in full to the Executive Director upon the last day of employment regardless of reason or rationale for termination (voluntary or involuntary).

a. By Coalition for Cause. The Coalition may terminate the employment of the Executive Director for cause at any time. "Cause" shall mean conviction of a felony or entry of a plea of no contest to criminal proceedings, regardless of whether there is an adjudication of guilt, gross neglect of duties, substance abuse, or material violation of this Agreement by the Executive Director. In the event of any such termination, the Executive Director shall have no claim for further compensation or severance pay, other than pay-out for all accrued PTO, beyond the date of termination.

b. Death or Disability. Employment shall terminate upon the Executive Director's death or permanent disability in which event the Executive Director, personal representative or estate shall receive such benefits as may be provided to all deceased employees under such employment policies as may be in effect at the time.

c. Resignation. The Executive Director may, at any time, resign upon not less than thirty (30) days prior written notice to the Coalition. The Executive will receive full compensation during that notice period. At its sole discretion, the Coalition will determine whether to require that the Executive perform the Executive's duties for the Coalition during that notice period. The

Coalition and the Executive will mutually agree upon any communications within the Coalition or to the public regarding the resignation.

d. By Coalition for Convenience. At the Coalition's discretion, the Coalition may terminate this Agreement for any or no reason upon thirty (30) days written notice. The parties may agree to an earlier separation. In the event of a termination for convenience, the Executive Director shall be entitled to be paid for the actual time worked plus ninety (90) days severance pay. In the event that a termination for cause is later determined to be invalid for any reason by a court or administrative proceeding, the termination shall automatically be converted to a termination for convenience.

e. Discontinuation of Services. The Coalition receives funding from the State through discretionary programs administered by the State of Florida. In the event State funding is terminated then the Executive Director's employment may terminate if there is not sufficient funding from other sources for the Coalition to continue operating.

10. Intellectual Property, Confidentiality, and Investments

The Executive recognizes and agrees that all copyrights, trademarks, or other intellectual property rights to created works arising in any way from the Executive Director's employment by the Coalition are the sole and exclusive property of the Coalition. The Executive agrees to not assert any such rights against the Coalition or any third parties. Upon termination of this Agreement by either party for any reason, the Executive will relinquish to the Coalition all documents, books, manuals, lists, records, publications or other writings, keys, credit cards, equipment, or other articles that came into the Executive's possession in connection with the Executive's employment by the Coalition. The Executive will maintain in confidence during and subsequent to the Executive's employment any information about the Coalition or its members which is confidential information or which might reasonably be expected by the Executive to be regarded by the Coalition as confidential.

11. Indemnification

The Coalition indemnifies, holds harmless, and will defend the Executive against claims arising against the Executive in connection with the Executive's performance of the duties of the Executive's employment by the Coalition to the full extent permitted by law, but not with respect to claims successfully resolved against the Executive that the Executive engaged in fraudulent, grossly negligent, or criminal acts.

12. Alternative Dispute Resolution

Any controversy or dispute arising in connection with or relating to this Employment Agreement of the Executive Director's employment with the Coalition shall be submitted to mediation or other mutually agreeable alternative dispute resolution prior to the commencement of any action under this Agreement. The parties agree to negotiate in good faith toward a resolution of such controversy or dispute. If after completion of such mediation or other dispute resolution, the parties have failed to reach resolution, venue shall lie in Hillsborough County, Florida, on any court action brought under this Agreement.

13. Entire Agreement and Notices

This document contains the entire agreement of the Coalition and the Executive. It may not be changed orally but only by an agreement in writing signed by the Coalition and the Executive. This Agreement supersedes and cancels all previous agreements between the Coalition and the Executive. Any notices or other communications required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be deemed to have been duly given if in writing and delivered personally, or sent by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, to the party at the address of the

Executive Director on file at the office of the Coalition and to the Coalition at 6800 N. Dale Mabry Highway, Suite 158, Tampa, Florida 33614.

14. Successors

This Agreement is binding upon the Coalition and the Executive, their heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns. Except as may be provided in policies approved by the Coalition Board or policies required by the State of Florida agency responsible for administering the School Readiness and Voluntary Pre-Kindergarten programs, the Executive will not assign or delegate any part of the Executive's rights or responsibilities under this Agreement unless the Executive Committee of the Coalition agrees in writing to the assignment or delegation. In the event dissolution of the Coalition, this Agreement will continue in force through the then-current period of employment. In the event of any merger, consolidation or reorganization involving the Coalition, this Agreement becomes an obligation of any legal successor or successors to the Coalition.

15. Choice of Law

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida.

This Agreement is effective as of September 12, 2016.

RECOMMENDED ACTION:	The ELCHC Communications and Outreach Committee is recommending that the ELCHC Board of Directors approve the proposed Board and Staff Social Media Policy as presented to be effective October 10, 2016.

NARRATIVE:

As nonprofits turn to social media, policies to govern their use have become the new frontier. A good social media policy provides clear guidelines as to what staff and Board members should and shouldn't do when posting and interacting with the community.

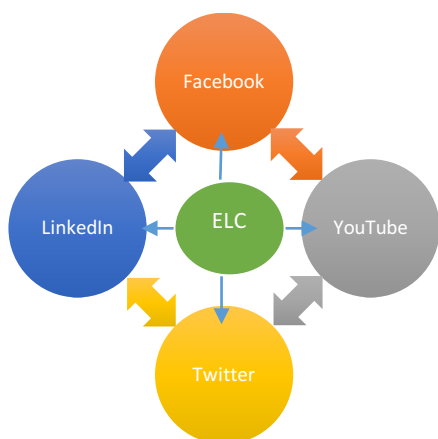
Our Goals

Our goals in making better use of new online communication tools (e.g., social media, or social networking sites) are:

- Expand and strengthen ELCHC's advocacy work for early childhood learning and education
- Expand our audience and advocacy base
- Better communicate with existing supporters and target audiences
- Strengthen our relationships with the Hillsborough community
- Fulfill our mission, vision and values as identified by the Board of Directors.

Our Online Communications Model

Increasingly, consumers are not only consumers of information on the Web, but are actively participating in online conversations and creating content. It is important that we integrate social networks and other online technologies into Coalition's communications work in a strategic fashion.



In order to integrate all of ELCHC's online communications work, we have adopted the wheel as our model (*see illustration at left*). At the core of ELCHC's communications strategy is a stronger, redesigned website, www.elchc.org. Radiating from the core and interacting with each other are online communications platforms where people already congregate and where we want to establish or strengthen our presence. In

addition to pushing out ELCHC's core messages and actions, we will seek to engage various

audiences by facilitating conversation, awareness, and action about early childhood care and education.

We have to experiment to find out which ones will work best for ELCHC. On new platforms, we have to be flexible in our engagement, recognizing that they may have good or bad consequences. Through this integrated model, ELCHC staff, activists, and members will leverage our storytelling across all media platforms—from traditional media like print, radio, and television, to online platforms like the Web and social networking sites.

The ELCHC Communications and Outreach Committee is recommending that the ELCHC Board of Directors approve the proposed Board and Staff Social Media Policy as presented to be effective October 10, 2016.

Purpose

To provide clear guidelines as to what staff and Board members should and shouldn't do when posting and interacting with the community on social media channels.

Scope

This policy applies to all direct, subcontracted, and temporary employees of the Early Learning Coalition of Hillsborough County and all members of the Early Learning Coalition of Hillsborough County Board of Directors.

Policy Statement

Our Principles

As an Organization,

...we will establish an ELCHC presence wherever target audiences or constituencies already congregate online. ELCHC's communications department and designated site managers and/or teams will maintain ELCHC's official sites in social media networks and other online platforms. We will actively invite and/or engage our constituents on these platforms if they are not already engaged through other means or if these new platforms will enhance our interaction with them. In most instances, we will sign up for all social networking sites, regardless of whether we will use them at all, so we can preserve our name in these sites.

...we will ensure that once we establish our presence in a social media site, it will be updated regularly according to the conventions of each site. In many cases, we will appoint a site manager and/or team that will coordinate with other ELCHC staff in creating its content. As is the policy, ultimate responsibility for all of ELCHC's editorial content in all media platforms rests with the Director of Communications and Outreach.

...we will be flexible as we encourage experimentation and testing of new social media tools and functionalities not currently used by ELCHC. Social media tools are developing rapidly. If no policies cover future technologies, we will be practical and flexible in dealing with them using whatever resources we have. However, we will adopt only those tools and platforms that will help us advance our mission, and not because they are trendy or cool. The main forum for discussion and coordination of such experiments is ELCHC's staff and Communications and Outreach Committee.

...we will encourage ELCHC staff and supporters to use social media tools. The essence of an online community is that it exists so we can support others and they, in turn, can support us. The more people we have Tweeting or talking online about early learning, the better it is for our mission. But while we encourage ELCHC staff to use these new tools, their social media sites shall be personal sites.

...we will provide training and resources to ELCHC staff and Board. Such training will only encourage familiarity with and acceptance of these tools as agents of change. As much as possible, these training and resources shall be provided online.

...and as appropriate, we will provide training and resources (e.g., tips, ideas, and guidelines) for key ELCHC activists. These will include an overview of ELCHC's current presence on social media platforms as well as

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standards and style. These resources will be gathered and updated regularly by the Communications staff and the site managers and/or teams.

...we will endeavor to ensure consistency of messages and actions across all media platforms. We will ensure that the essence of ELCHC's messages remains true to our current advocacy priorities and mission, no matter what media is used. We will also encourage the voices of owners of personal social media sites to enhance messages and actions being promoted by ELCHC. Whenever possible, we will solicit ideas and stories from our constituents to help enhance our messages and tactics. We will change our campaign tactics and messages if needed.

...we will adhere to ELCHC's policies, including those covering privacy and confidential information, and the ELCHC Brand and Style Guide.

...we will be guided by ELCHC policy staff regarding actions on legislation that we are currently campaigning on.

...we will identify ourselves clearly in what we write and what we post. When acting as a ELCHC staff member, we will always identify ourselves as such in responding to posts, blogs, or other social media. We shall not engage in arguments or "flame wars".

...we will respect copyright rules. We will properly cite our sources, and post only items that are covered by fair use or published under Creative Commons. Otherwise, we will seek permission first.

As Individuals,

...we will not use our identity as ELCHC employees and Board members, including our ELCHC email accounts, in association with personal sites that are outside the scope of ELCHC'S mission.

...we will be guided by ELCHC policy staff regarding actions on legislation that we currently are campaigning on. While personal social network accounts (e.g., Facebook) should remain personal, owners will be encouraged to call for actions consistent with actions being promoted by ELCHC. Such messages can and may be re-tooled into the voice of the owner, but not in a manner that could be construed as new ELCHC policy. To the extent possible, sample messages will be provided.

...we will be responsible for what we write and what we post. Our use of social media sites is governed by our mission, vision and values– and by good judgment and common sense. In general, we will tell our stories responsibly and not write or post anything that would embarrass our families, or reflect badly on ELCHC.

...we will ensure that our website and social networking activities will not interfere with our work commitments. Unless we are officially designated to work with social media, we will reasonably limit our personal use of social networking sites at work.

Our Process

Where ELCHC does not have an online presence and feels that it requires one, ELCHC's CEO and/or Director of Communications and Outreach will recommend a site manager and/or team, as the case may be, to establish such a presence. Site managers and/or teams can come from any ELCHC department but shall always coordinate its work with Communications and Outreach staff. The site managers and/or teams will administer these sites on a daily basis and will ensure that these are regularly updated. These sites will be administered consistent with *ELCHC's Brand and Style Guide*.

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ISSUE:	REBRAND WEBSITE UPDATE PROPOSAL
FISCAL IMPACT:	\$10,000
FUNDING SOURCE:	Board of County Commissioners Grant Funding (BOCC)
RECOMMENDED ACTION:	The ELCHC Communications and Outreach Committee is recommending that the ELCHC Board of Directors approve the proposal submitted by Sparxoo to update the ELCHC website to encompass newly adopted brand standards.

NARRATIVE:

The ELCHC embarked on its rebranding efforts in March of 2016 and officially completed the process in early July 2016. Some of the major products of that process have been the new ELCHC positioning statement, a new logo and a new tag line. To date, the ELCHC has implemented a soft launch of the brand and will now move to updating another key branding element —the ELCHC website.

Although the ELCHC website was redesigned and launched in early January 2016 it must now be brought into alignment with the newly adopted brand identity (*logo placement, tagline use, new corporate colors and fonts, new positioning, etc.*). The ELCHC website is a major component of the new brand and is crucial to the Coalition telling its story and communicating with the agency's major audiences. Therefore, bringing the site up to the newly adopted standards as quickly as possible is imperative to a successful long-term rebrand.

The attached proposal for the website update was developed by the firm Sparxoo and outlines the steps, timeline and cost of upgrading the ELCHC website. Sparxoo is also the agency that conducted the ELCHC website redesign in January and rebrand effort just completed by the Coalition.

The ELCHC Communications and Outreach Committee is recommending that the ELCHC Board of Directors approve the proposal submitted by Sparxoo to update the ELCHC website to encompass newly adopted brand standards.

ELCHC Website Proposal

Keys to Success Relaunch

- Integrate positioning and storytelling
 - Make sure the language is updated to reflect the new value proposition
 - Rewrite the headlines
 - Make changes to demonstrate that ELCHC is a trusted resource and to further emphasize the focus on family and child

ISSUE:	Execute School Readiness Match Contract with School Board of Hillsborough County
FISCAL IMPACT:	\$1,825,339
FUNDING SOURCE:	Children’s Board of Hillsborough County and Hillsborough County
RECOMMENDED ACTION:	Authorize staff to execute a contract with School Board of Hillsborough County in the amount of \$1,825,339 for the period October 1, 2016 to September 30, 2017.

Background:

The Coalition is required by the Office of Early Learning to secure a 6% local match for School Readiness funds and a 1:1 match for the \$1,000,000 Child Care Executive Partnership (CCEP) funds used to serve low-income working families. Historically, the Children’s Board of Hillsborough County (CBHC) and Hillsborough County BOCC have allocated funds to meet these requirements.

The CBHC funds totaling \$1,723,239 support the required 6% match for funds used to serve low-income working families (\$ 805,339) and \$897,900 of the 1:1 match required by the CCEP. Hillsborough County has provided the other \$102,100 in funding through child care fees and licenses to meet the total \$1,000,000 CCEP match. In addition, the CBHC has allocated \$20,000 in funds for afterschool and summer programs for children whose families who receive services through Metropolitan Ministries.

For FY2016-2017, the Coalition, with Board approval, will continue to contract with the School Board of Hillsborough County consistent with the funding earmarks established by the CBHC and Hillsborough County to distribute the funding to contracted child care providers serving eligible children.

The Coalition has signed the CBHC contract and anticipate the contract to be returned effective October 1, 2016 in the amount \$1,723,239. Once the contract with CBHC is executed, funds will be available for the period October 1, 2016 to September 30, 2017. This contract was approved at the CBHC board meeting on September 22, 2016. The staff will utilize funds from Hillsborough County in a contract executed July 1, 2016 for the additional CCEP Match. All these funds mentioned are used solely to provide direct child care services.

Staff recommends that the Board authorize staff to enter into a contract with the School Board of Hillsborough County.

ISSUE: REVISION OF THE COALITION'S ANTI-FRAUD PLAN

FISCAL IMPACT:

FUNDING SOURCE:

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Approve the revised Anti-Fraud Plan

Background:

The Office of Early Learning (OEL) contacted staff on October 5, 2016 regarding the Coalition's Anti-Fraud Plan that had been submitted June 2016. Per OEL, the plan needed to be revised to include the following information:

A description of the plan's program and procedures for education and training personnel on how to detect and prevent fraud, abuse, and overpayment including an annual self-assessment of the coalition's internal controls, policies and procedures. 6M-9.400 (3)(d).

The plan has been revised to include information regarding the annual self-assessment of the Coalition's internal controls, policies and procedures. The revision to the plan must be approved by the Board prior to submitting.

Early Learning Coalition of Hillsborough County Anti-Fraud Plan

Plan Statement

The Anti-Fraud Plan addresses the detection and prevention of overpayments, abuse, and fraud relating to the provision of and payment for the School Readiness program and Voluntary Prekindergarten program services. The Plan addresses parents or legal guardians of children enrolled in the School Readiness or VPK programs. *Note that provider fraud is a violation of the terms of the contract and addressed in the state wide contracts rules.*

The Anti-Fraud Plan serves to support organizational processes and staff in prevention of fraud, build on employee knowledge and awareness of fraud prevention and describe the coalition's procedures for detecting and investigating possible acts of fraud, abuse of services and related overpayment. Due process procedures for suspending or terminating a recipient's eligibility for School Readiness or VPK programs and the recipient's right to appeal the decision are included in the Plan.

The Plan will be submitted to the Office of Early Learning (OEL) Office of Inspector General (OIG) by requested date annually.

Plan Definitions

Recipient - The parent or legal guardian whose child was determined eligible for School Readiness or Voluntary Prekindergarten Education Program benefits.

Fraud - An intentional deception, omission, or misrepresentation made by a person with knowledge that the deception, omission, or misrepresentation may result in unauthorized benefit to that person or another person, or any aiding and abetting of the commission of such an act. The term includes any act that constitutes fraud under applicable federal or state law.

Suspension - When services are temporarily no longer provided, however the parents do not have to go to the waiting list when their suspension is finished.

Termination - When services are ended and the recipient would have to return to the waiting list when their termination is expired.

Description of Organizational Structure with Plan Responsibilities

The Compliance Manager with Hillsborough County Public Schools (ELC of Hillsborough County's Primary Service Provider) is responsible for implementing the Coalition's School Readiness anti-fraud activities; the Coalition's Compliance Manager is responsible for implementing the Coalition's Voluntary Prekindergarten (VPK) anti-fraud activities.

The Coalition's Chief Operating Officer is responsible for reviewing an initial appeal request submitted by the recipient for decision to uphold or modify the suspension or termination.

The following positions are responsible for the daily activities related to prevention, detection, investigation, and reporting of possible overpayment resulting from potential fraud or abuse:

Early Learning Coalition of Hillsborough County Staff

- Chief Operating Officer
- Family Service Coordinator
- Family Service Specialists
- Chief Financial Officer
- Financial Service Manager
- Provider Service Specialists
- Financial Service Specialists

Hillsborough County Public School Staff

- Supervisor of Coordinating Services
- Coordinating Service Specialists
- Compliance/Fraud Manager
- Reimbursement Staff

Plan Procedures

Procedures Review –The Early Learning Coalition of Hillsborough County (ELCHC) and Hillsborough County Public Schools (HCPS) will annually review job descriptions and internal processes to confirm appropriate separation of duties is in place, and review internal controls to reduce risk.

ELC Staff Education/Awareness/Training – Training will be targeted both at policy level and operational level.

- ELCHC and HCPS management staff will ensure that all staff review the following policy topics annually: Code of Conduct and Ethics, Whistleblower Policy, Record Retention Policy, Workplace Conduct, and Conflict of Interest and Business Ethics.
- Additionally all staff will be reminded of specific Internal Control policies and practices in place to prevent fraud. On a regular and routine basis, it is the responsibility of all management staff to ensure that all internal control practices, appropriate fiscal procedures and separation of duties are being followed.
- ELCHC Family Services, Provider Services and Reimbursement Services meet at least monthly to review any changes or issues that may arise.
- ELCHC Compliance Manager monitors continually throughout the year and holds meetings as needed to discuss/resolve findings.
- HCPS provides training to Client Service Specialists on interviewing techniques and resources that help identify possible fraud. The training includes “red flag” areas such as receipt of cash payments and/or client report of no income for a significant period of time, identification of altered and/or falsified documents, as well as the proper procedures for reporting of suspected fraud to the appropriate HCPS administrator.

- ELCHC and HCPS management staff complete an annual self-assessment of internal controls, policies and procedures.

SR and VPK Parent Education and Awareness

- Display fraud awareness posters at ELCHC and HCPS eligibility offices
- Include a fraud awareness statement in SR parent packets with appropriate phone number to report any suspected fraud
- SR Coordinating Service Specialists review parent responsibilities in detail during the interview process and emphasize the importance of reporting changes in their circumstances within ten (10) days. Parent are required to sign the SR Rights & Responsibilities document which contains the above information.

SR and VPK Provider Education and Awareness

- Encourage child care providers to report potential fraud to ELCHC/HCPS staff via provider communication venues such as the Provider Focus Magazine, Provider Portal Notes and/or Email Blasts
- Provide periodic reminders to providers about having procedures in place to prevent fraud

SR and VPK Provider Education and Awareness

- Encourage child care providers to report potential fraud to ELC or ECS staff through provider communication venues including email or portal communications, and provider group meetings
- Periodic reminders to providers about procedures in place to prevent fraud in addition to regular practices of monitoring that occur with providers that also keep providers aware of ELC's/ECS's intention to prevent and/or detect fraudulent practices
- Regular monitoring by ELCHC Provider Service Staff keeps providers aware of ELCHC's intent to prevent and/or detect fraud

Providers, Parents, employees, and Public Access to Reporting of Potential Fraud

- Statement on website with phone number to report potential fraud for parents, providers, and general public

ELC Detection and Investigation of Acts of Fraud, Abuse or Overpayment

- Monthly unannounced review of work products and follow up on questionable circumstances are conducted by appropriate ELCHC and/or HCPS staff
- Monthly review, research, and follow up of data quality edit reports generated by the Office of Early Learning by designated ELCHC and/or HCPS staff
- Documented verification of child care referrals from other organizations through periodic cross reference review of children in service
- Daily alertness of SR Coordinating Service Specialists to inconsistencies through regular operational processes with recipient(s). At initial placement and eligibility redetermination, HCPS staff reviews the recipient's information for "red flags". If the Specialist believes "red flags" exist, but cannot be confirmed, then the case is

forwarded to the SR Coordinating Services Supervisor and the Compliance/Fraud Manager for further review.

If inconsistencies are identified through any of the above means, the ELCHC or HCPS Compliance Manager will conduct a phone interview with the recipient(s) and obtain verification from parent or legal guardian within five (5) business days to resolve inconsistencies, which could include but not be limited to income, residential documentation, or household composition, and determine if situation is resolved or warrants next steps of due process provisions for termination or suspension of SR and/or VPK benefits.

If there is reasonable suspicion that a recipient has committed fraud in the receipt of SR and/or VPK services, designated ELCHC and/or HCPS staff shall calculate associated overpaid benefit amounts and follow the due process provisions for termination or suspension of SR and/or VPK benefits.

If it is determined that further investigation is warranted the ELCHC and/or HCPS Compliance Manager shall report the case of potential fraud to the Florida Office of Early Learning Fraud for review.

Due Process Provisions for Termination or Suspension of School Readiness or Voluntary Prekindergarten Benefits

The Coalition and/or HCPS will provide written notice of the intended action to suspend or terminate benefits to the recipient to be affected and must clearly advise of the allegations, the basis of the allegations the intended action and the date the action is to be imposed. The written notice shall be sent at least fourteen (14) calendar days prior to the intended action. The written notice will be translated in the recipient's native language if prior communications from ELCHC/HCPS with the recipient have been translated.

The written advance notice shall include following:

- The procedure for the recipient to follow to attempt to appeal the decision.
- A statement, in bold print, that the failure to file a timely appeal waives the right to an appeal.
- Notice of the potential for repayment of improper benefits if the conclusion of fraud is upheld, including any benefits received after the receipt of the written advance notice.
- The procedure for the recipient to obtain a copy of his or her file.
- The amount of overpayment to be recovered, if applicable.
- The length of time for which the recipient's benefits are suspended or the date of the termination of benefits, if applicable.

The following general guide for penalties will be applied, however, considerations will also include the length of time proportionate to the alleged offense committed, consistent with suspensions or terminations issued to other recipients who allegedly committed comparable offenses, and may also consider prior offenses, as appropriate.

Penalties Guidelines

- First determination of fraud, eligibility is suspended for the longer of six months or restitution of overpaid benefits.
- Second determination, eligibility is terminated the longer of one year or restitution of overpaid benefits.
- Third and subsequent determinations, eligibility is terminated the longer of five years or restitution of overpaid benefits.

The recipient has a right to challenge within fourteen (14) business days; if the challenge is before benefits are terminated or suspended, then benefits remain in place for the duration of initial challenge. However, if the decision is upheld, any services received during that timeframe will be included with the overpayment amount.

A suspension or termination shall not be applied against recipients with a valid at-risk referral.

Recipient Right to Challenge Decision

Pre appeal Resolution Procedure

If recipient believes that the conclusion of fraud was made in error, the recipient should first seek to resolve the matter by contacting ELCHC/HCPS and providing the necessary documentation to resolve the issue. The Chief Operating Officer will consider all statements, review all documents and may request any additional evidence or information if it is necessary and relevant to the review. The recipient will be notified in writing of the determination within ten (10) days of the parent review. The C.E.O. of the Coalition shall not be involved in the pre-appeal resolution of the issue.

If the recipient believes that the issue was not resolved during the pre-appeal resolution procedure, the appeal procedure is outlined in *Florida Rule 6M-9-400 Early Learning Coalition Anti-Fraud Plan, subsection (e) and (f) as follows:*

Appeal Resolution Procedure:

If the recipient believes that the issue was not resolved by the coalition/ECS, the recipient may file a formal written appeal for review by the C.E.O. of the Coalition, using the following procedure:

1. Submit a written appeal to the C.E.O. or other executive staff person as designated by the coalition board. The appeal must fully describe the nature of the error the recipient believes has been made and shall contain any documentation which supports the recipient's claim.
2. The appeal shall be postmarked or emailed before the date of the intended action. The recipient who fails to file a timely appeal waives the right of appeal.
3. If the recipient files a timely appeal, he or she will not be suspended or terminated from the program until the written decision of the C.E.O. or the original date of the intended action, whichever is later.

4. The C.E.O. of the coalition or other executive staff person designated by the coalition board must respond to the recipient, in writing, within thirty (30) days of receiving the appeal with a decision as to whether the suspension or termination will be upheld or modified.
5. The recipient who wishes to appeal the decision of the C.E.O. of the Coalition or other executive staff person designated by the Coalition board may request further review by an appeals committee in accordance with subsection (e) of this rule. The request for further review by an appeals committee must be submitted to the Coalition in writing within ten (10) calendar days of the date of the C.E.O. or other executive staff person designated by the-Coalition board's written response to the recipient's formal written appeal.

The recipient shall be given the opportunity to defend his or her position in an orderly proceeding of the appeals committee. When the meeting of the appeals committee is scheduled, the recipient shall be notified of the date of the appeals committee, informed that it is a public meeting, and informed that any information presented may be used by other state agencies.

1. The appeals committee shall be selected by the Chairman of the Board of the coalition and a chair of the appeals committee shall be named.
2. The appeals committee shall be convened within forty-five (45) calendar days of receipt of the recipient's request for an appeal.
3. The recipient shall be provided up to thirty (30) minutes to present their position and any information they wish the appeals committee to consider.
4. The Coalition staff, excluding the Executive Director or other executive staff person designated by the coalition board shall be available to provide any information requested by the committee.
5. The appeals committee will consider all statements, review all documents and may request any additional evidence or information from the parties if an appeals committee member believes it is necessary and relevant to the decision making. The required final determination letter will be tolled for the length of time given to provide the additional information.
6. The appeals committee shall select or appoint a member of the coalition, excluding the C.E.O. the coalition or other executive staff person designated by the coalition board to memorialize the events of the appeals committee proceeding and the final determination including the basis for the decision.
7. The appellant shall be notified in writing of the appeals committee's determination within ten (10) days of the date of the meeting.
8. The determination of the appeals committee shall be final.

For criminal prosecution with restitution, the ELCHC/HCPs will follow the ruling from the court regarding restitution plan

Monthly Reporting Process to OEL

The ELCHC's Compliance Manager will submit an electronic report monthly reporting the parents and providers terminated from services as a result of fraud, per Rule 6M.9.400 subsection (b).

Process for Mandatory Reporting Fraud and Abuse through the OEL Fraud Referral System

At the point when potential fraud has been communicated to the recipient, The Compliance Manager will make the mandatory referral for potential fraud or abuse investigation using Office of Early Learning *Fraud Referral System*. The referral includes the recipient information, amount of overpayment, discovery date and a brief summary of the allegations, and notification of any evidencing documents available that substantiate the allegations. At this time, the Compliance Manager also notifies the Office of Early Learning's Inspector General's office that a fraud referral has been submitted.

Note the coalition's fraud investigation and appeals procedures outlined in this plan will complement the OEL referral process to Department of Financial Services through the *Fraud Referral System*. If the recipient appeals the decision through the Coalition appeals process, the Compliance Manager will update the referral information in the *Fraud Referral System* as appeal decisions are made throughout the appeal process.

ISSUE:	IECP Lease/Relocation

RECOMMENDED ACTION:	Approve the Space/Lease Committee’s recommendation to execute a three year lease which matches the main office leased space of Suite 158.

NARRATIVE:

Currently, we have two training spaces, the Dale Mabry office and the office off US Highway 301. These offices hold up to thirty to forty participants, respectively. These training spaces are used by the ELCHC, all partner agencies, and stakeholders both locally and statewide.

The number of trainings offered weekly range from three to five, with an average of six completed at our sites. The demand for training space is so great that we often get requests from partners that we are unable to honor due to bookings. Weekly we serve a minimum of two hundred providers.

The Early Learning Coalition of Hillsborough County is charged with the training and technical assistance of the provider community that it serves for both VPK and School Readiness services. With that said, this at any given time serves an approximated 5500 early care and education professionals (DOL).

To best serve the early care and education community, the Early Learning Coalition Staff suggests that we address two needs: a) training space capacity and b) location. Both needs were identified through survey and service delivery data. Market rate for space in an area that would permit the space needed and desired location, averages 18-22 dollars per square foot (Class B Space). The necessary space to meet both needs would need to be more centrally located within Hillsborough County on a major thoroughfare and provide 7, 000 to 9,000 square feet. This would permit two large training spaces for 40 participant as well as house ELCHC training and technical assistance staff. Further, this space could be used for large scale workshops, board meetings, and mini conferences for both the ELCHC and stockholding partners.

Specific Details from Executive Committee:

In a hope to collocate the training space with the main office, Hakeem Investments was contacted to review all potential space available. Two suites were identified. The suite that meets the committee’s criteria most closely is suite 130. It is 7,615 sq. ft. of space. This space will be divided in the following way:

- Adequate training space: two training spaces of 1,100 and 757 sq. ft. respectively.
- Space for lending library
- Provider workspace/business center
- Adequate accommodations for LiveScan

Further, suite 130 would also allow the coalition to consolidate office thereby improving staff collaboration, enhancing provider services and relations while also being fiscally prudent.

RECOMMENDED ACTION:	Allocate up to \$150,000 for Quality Counts for Kids Provider Supports

NARRATIVE:

Quality Counts for Kids is Hillsborough County's continuous quality improvement program for all legally operating centers and family child care homes. This quality rating improvement system (QRIS) was launched in 2004 and is a systemic approach to assess, improve and communicate the level of quality in early in early care and education programs. Similar to rating systems for restaurants and hotels, Quality Counts for Kids awards quality rating to programs that meet a set of defined program standards. Ratings range from one to five stars. Programs that meet the standards to obtain Star Level 1 have achieved a level of quality that exceeds the standards required by Child Care Licensing.

One of the key components of a QRIS is financial supports which are generally intended to help support the cost of improving and/or maintaining program quality. Since its inception, Quality Counts for Kids has offered financial support through a grant process which is aligned to each program's quality improvement plan. Traditionally, these funds have been used to purchase classroom equipment and non-consumable materials (e.g. curricula), support practitioners' professional development (e.g. conference attendance), accreditation fees, and/or staff retention strategies. Grantees are required to maintain records, including receipts to verify the use of grant funds towards quality improvement.

According to a study conducted by the National Women's Law Center and the Center for Law and Social Policy (CLASP) child care program directors in nine state indicated that grants and bonuses were needed to cover the substantial additional costs involved with attaining and maintaining higher program quality rating. Directors thought it was important to provide sufficient financial supports all along the quality rating scale, from programs at the bottom of the scale struggling to improve, to those programs at the top of the scale working to maintain the highest quality standards, and those in between.

During contract negotiations, the Children's Board of Hillsborough County notified staff that the Coalition's Quality Counts for Kids award would be reduced from \$1,096,377 by \$520,483 to \$575,894. This reduction eliminated the \$245,000 in financial supports that were available to participating Quality Counts for Kids providers to enhance or maintain quality. Staff is recommending that \$150,000 of unallocated funding be allocated to continue financial supports to participating Quality Counts Providers.

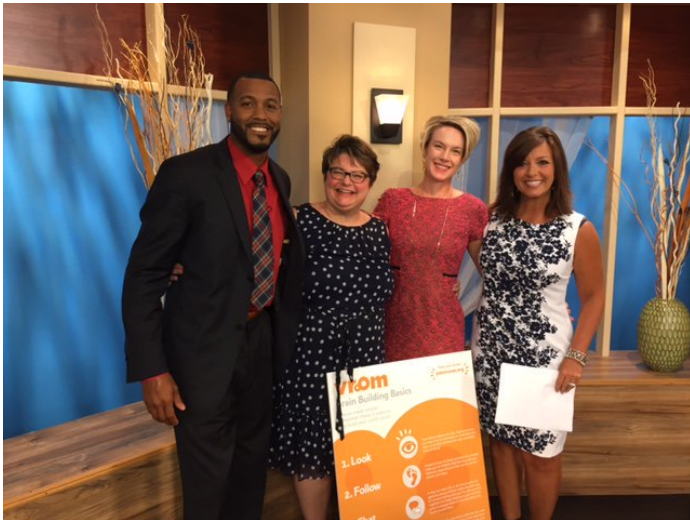

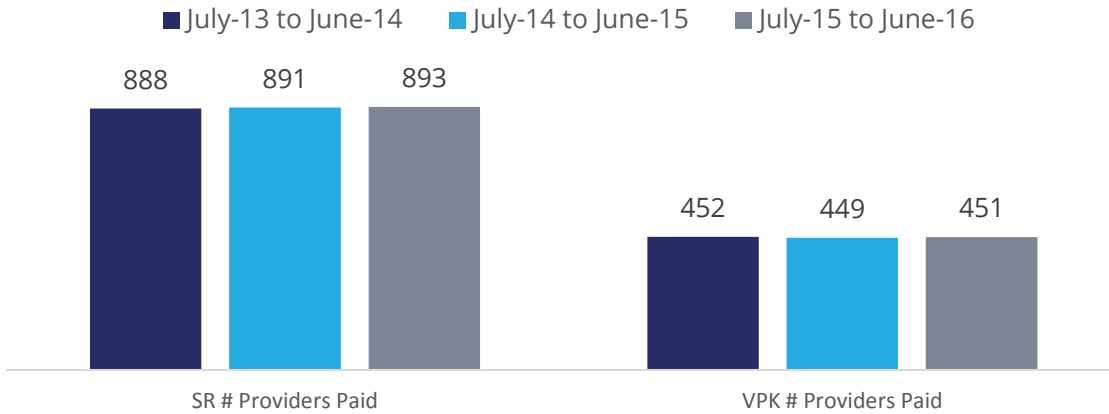

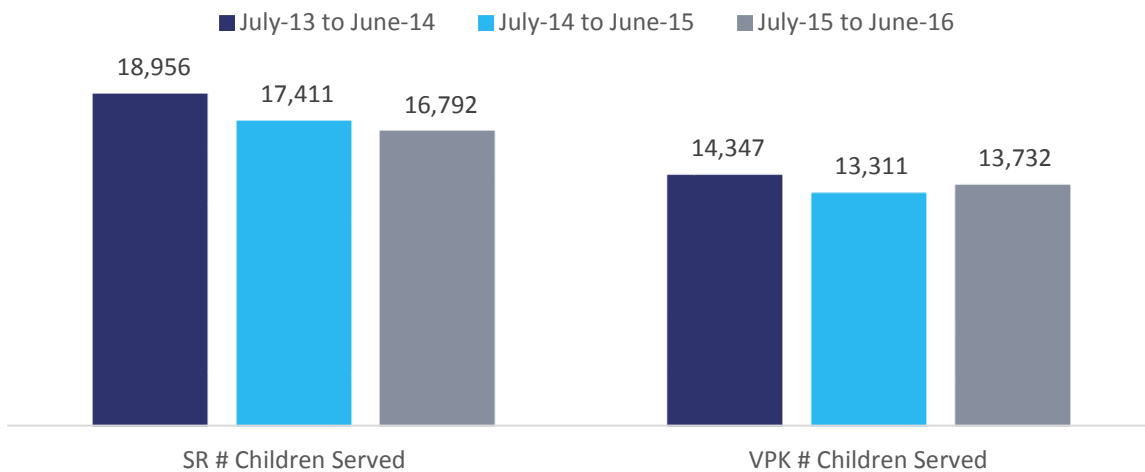

Providers Paid by Funding Type



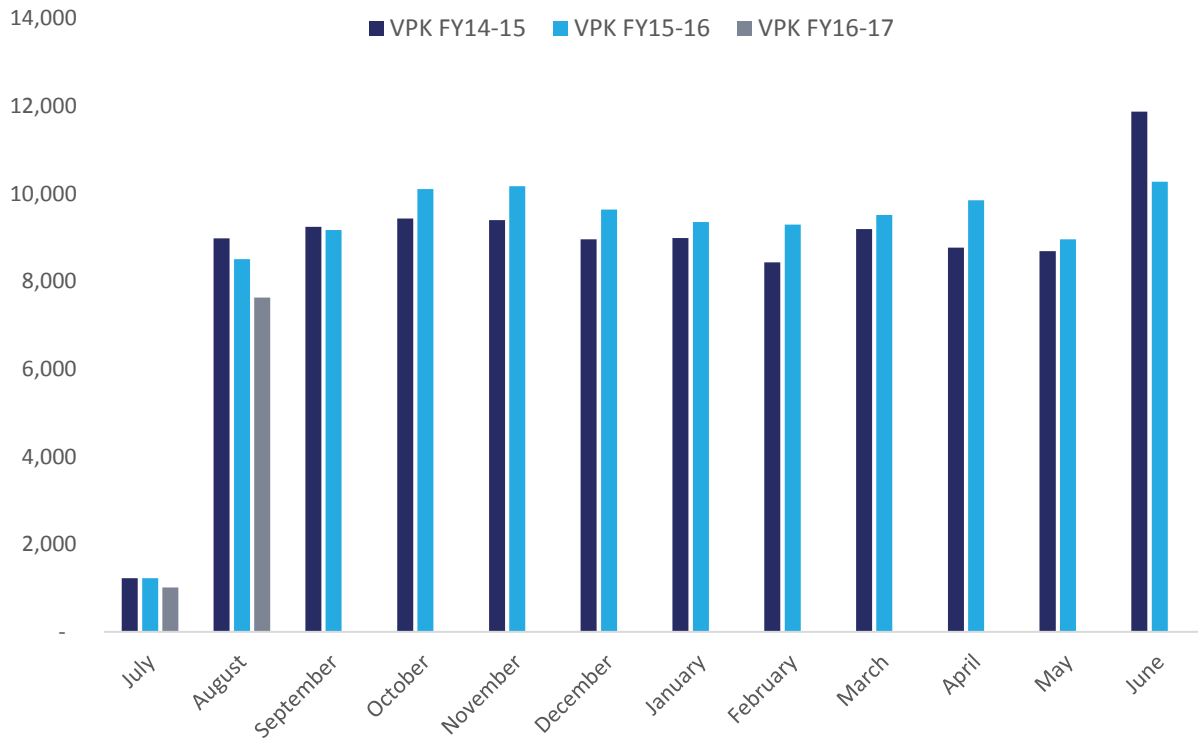

VPK Children Served by Funding Year



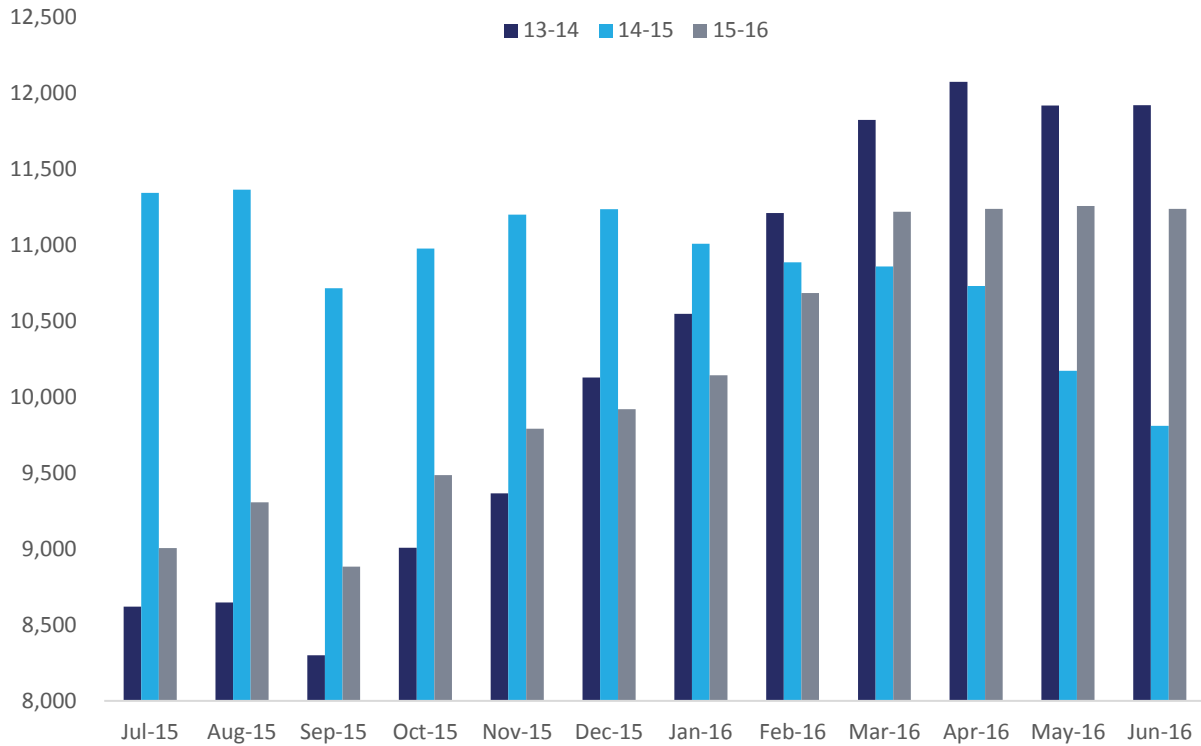

EVALUATION OF DIRECT ENHANCEMENT SERVICES

Comprehensive Consumer Education

The foundation of the Coalition’s comprehensive consumer education is Child Care Resource and Referral’s (CCR&R) work with families. CCR&R assists families who combine work and family responsibilities in managing life transitions that include entry into the workforce, return to work, education or training, job changes, shift or schedule changes and family emergencies. As increasing numbers of families combine the roles of working and rearing children, child care becomes an important partner in helping parents manage their responsibilities. Finding, choosing, and beginning to use child care becomes one of the earliest and biggest challenges for the working parent.

Trained resource and referral specialists offer unbiased information and guidance to families about child care options, provide information to help families identify quality

early learning programs, suggest financial assistance strategies and provide referrals to other community programs as needed. If deemed eligible for School Readiness, families are counseled to select the type of care and provider that best meets the needs of the child in care as well as the family. There are no charges/fees associated with a provider listing in the Child Care Resource and Referral Database or for referral to the provider’s program. The information reported about a provider’s program is objective program information based on standards that are attainable for providers based on their type of care.

Additionally, Coalition VPK staff provides information to families about how to check VPK provider readiness rates, the structure of the VPK program as well as discussing other child care services available to support children’s early learning.

Following are FY 2015-2016 highlights:

- 5,025 child care referrals were provided to families
- Responded to 400 online inquiries submitted by families
- Distributed 3,000 consumer education packets to families visiting eligibility and enrollment locations
- Distributed 2,000 Quality Child Care Listing booklets to families and case managers to help foster families' access programs that are Gold Seal Accredited and/or participate in the local Quality Rating Improvement System entitled Quality Counts for Kids.
- 19,059 eligibility services were performed
- 8,572 Recertifications By Mail (RBM) sent out with 7,786 clients responding

Provider Financial Supports

The ELC of Hillsborough operates a comprehensive provider QRIS program entitled Quality Counts for Kids (QCFK). Providers participating in the QCFK program had access to training; technical assistance and coaching along with grant funds to support their programs' continuous quality improvement efforts. These funds, which are provided via a grant from the local Children's Services Council – The Children's Board of Hillsborough County, were used to purchase classroom materials, support staff wage incentives, and professional development activities to help programs increase the quality of services delivered to families. In order to apply for these support dollars, participating programs have to undergo a formal assessment and validation and then receive an official Quality Star Rating from the Coalition. Based on that validation and quality rating, programs subsequently develop and submit a Quality Action Plan. Upon approval of the action plan, programs submit an application for grant funds along with any required supporting documentation for items to be purchased with grant dollars. Once awarded grant dollars, programs must submit regular progress reports that are in alignment with their approved Quality Action Plan. For FY15-16, 73 programs received \$201,470.38 in financial supports to aid in improving the quality of their programs.

ELCHC coaching staff continued to provide support to the five coaching pilot programs focused on the implementation of the Creative Curriculum and the use of Teaching Strategies Gold (TSG). Forty-seven (47) teaching staff and administrators each received a stipend of \$250 upon achieving inter-rater reliability in the use of TSG. A total of \$11,750 was awarded. In addition, my Teachstone subscriptions were also purchased for pilot teaching staff and administrators. my Teachstone is an online subscription service designed to combine CLASS observation data with individualized professional development resources. It enables CLASS observers to enter observation results and coaches to recommend the numerous videos, articles and courses to support quality improvement goals. Fifty (50) subscriptions were purchased for \$5,000.

The Creative Curriculum coaching pilot project was expanded to include 16 additional child care centers and fifteen 15 family child care homes. To support quality improvement efforts while coaching in these programs Creative Curriculum materials were purchased and distributed. This

included 15 Mighty Minutes in Spanish or English, 13 sets of the Creative Curriculum Daily Resources for Infants, Toddlers, and Twos and 46 sets of the Creative Curriculum Preschool System. Another 17 sets of the Creative Curriculum System were awarded to those child care programs demonstrating commitment to continuous quality improvement through the maintenance of their QCFK star level or achieving submission for a star within a designated time frame.

One hundred twenty-five (125) subscriptions for the 2-hour on-line Introduction to Toddler or Preschool CLASS trainings were purchased and distributed to teaching staff and administrators of coaching programs at a cost of this was \$4,375. CLASS Dimensions Guides for each age group in English and Spanish were also purchased and provided with these subscriptions. Since an Introduction to Infant CLASS course is not currently available, infant teaching staff were given the Infant CLASS Dimensions Guide. The cost of these 125 Dimensions Guides was \$1,687.50. An additional 275 Guides were also purchased for future use.

Training and Technical Assistance

The ELC of Hillsborough partnered with the Early Childhood Council of Hillsborough County (ECC), University of South Florida Program Wide Positive Behavior Support, Champions for Children, Hillsborough County Public Schools-School Readiness Program, Hillsborough Community College Early Literacy Matters (ELM), and University of Florida Hillsborough County Extension to offer an extensive variety of trainings. Training information was distributed through the Coalition's training publication entitled The Bulletin. A new ELCHC Learning Management System (LMS) was rolled out in January, 2016. Providers may also access training information through the LMS course catalogue as well as create their own account and register directly for selected courses. Partner agencies have access to their own training coursework information and registrations through the LMS. A total of ninety-five (95) trainings were offered to 1,011 early childhood practitioners.

For a complete list and description of trainings offered to school readiness program providers, staff, and parents, see **Attachment A, pages 16 - 25**.

Coaching

For a second year, Coalition staff continued to provide coaching to support the implementation of Creative Curriculum in 21 classrooms serving children birth to 5 in five child care centers. In addition to the Creative Curriculum Pilot Project, Coalition staff offered coaching to 15 new family child care home providers and 16 new child care centers. A total of 142 practitioners in these programs received coaching to enhance curriculum usage, staff-child interactions and global quality. Applicable pre and post ERS or CLASS Observations were conducted to determine individual teacher growth. Of the 91 post assessments conducted prior to June 30, 2016, 87 (96%) demonstrated growth.

All classrooms in the 5 pilot coaching sites, as well as 8 of the new 16 sites, implemented Teaching Strategies Gold. 903 children were served with scores in Teaching Strategies GOLD (TSG) at least one time during this past school year. Of those children, 756 had 2 checkpoints and 611 (81%) of the children are meeting or exceeding widely held expectations in all 6 domains at the time of the post assessment.

The Coalition's sub-contractor provided coaching to 95 practitioners to enhance global quality.

Quality Activities for Infants & Toddler Care

Teaching staff for infants, toddlers and twos in the nine classrooms of the five pilot child care centers participated in the Creative Curriculum Pilot Project for the second year. With the addition of the 15 new family child care homes and 16 new child care centers, a total of 48 infant, toddler and twos practitioners have received on-site coaching this past year. All new teaching staff completed 12 hours of training in the curriculum. Those in the 17 new infant, toddler and twos classrooms implementing Teaching Strategies GOLD also completed the 12 hours of training in TSG. The CLASS or the ITERS-R observations were used to measure growth. Twenty-eight of 31 post observations conducted before June 30, 2016 showed improvement.



Monitoring

School Readiness

During the 2015-2016 fiscal year, Coalition staff monitored 460 School Readiness program providers for Tier 1 compliance using a tracking log. This monitoring included the date of submission of the School Readiness Contract Documents in accordance with Rule 6M-4.610, the date of the completion and submission of the annual CCR&R Provider Updates, and the verification of the provider conducting Developmental Screenings and monthly enrollment and attendance certifications. In addition, a random sample of 120 contracted School Readiness program providers were monitored using the Statewide Provider Monitoring Tool for Tier Two compliance. As a result of the monitoring, 16 providers were classified as High Risk and will be monitored again this year using the Tier Two monitoring form OEL-SR 20M.

Voluntary Prekindergarten Program

On-site monitoring of all contracted VPK providers for FY 2015-2016 were conducted in accordance with the terms and conditions of the State of Florida Statewide Voluntary Prekindergarten Provider Contract (Form OEL-VPK 20), dated August 2014, and referenced in 6M-8.301, F.A.C.

Inclusion

The Early Childhood Council of Hillsborough County (ECC) provides inclusion support services to providers and families in Hillsborough County. The local Warm Line is available to all child care centers and family child care homes as well as parents who request assistance regarding child care arrangements or concerns for their children with special needs. The goals of the Inclusion Initiative at the ELCHC are:

1. To increase the number of providers who offer quality inclusive programs for children with disabilities and special health care needs.
2. To enhance the confidence, ability level, and education of caregivers who care for children with disabilities and special health care needs.
3. To assist providers and the families they serve in understanding and accessing the community resources and services available for children with disabilities and special health care needs.

Early Learning Coalition staff completed a total of 379 inspection site visits during this period, using the Coalition's VPK Monitoring Tool, (revised 1/2015). Each private provider received a minimum of one (1) inspection per program type (school year/summer), which exceeded the State requirement. Additionally, 55 private providers received a second and/or third re-inspection visit founded on the Coalition's risk-based monitoring system. The Risk Based Monitoring System included the following elements:

- New VPK providers or change of ownership
- Providers on probation (providers not meeting the kindergarten readiness rate)
- Providers on probation choosing to implement and complete a Staff Development Plan
- Providers with documented non-compliances of either qualified staff or instructor/child ratio on the first inspection
- Providers who were the subject of a complaint to the Coalition

The School District of Hillsborough County monitored 55 contracted sites during the 2015-2016 fiscal year.

4. To increase community awareness of the need for, requirements of, and benefits associated with inclusive child care for children with disabilities and special health care needs.
5. ECC Inclusion Services Program offers trainings on a variety of issues, including health, child development, environmental adaptations, curriculum, and laws and regulations. During FY15-16, ECC reports the following activities:

Number of Warm Line calls – 148
Number of children referred for inclusion support Services – 180
Number of teachers provided with technical assistance – 186*

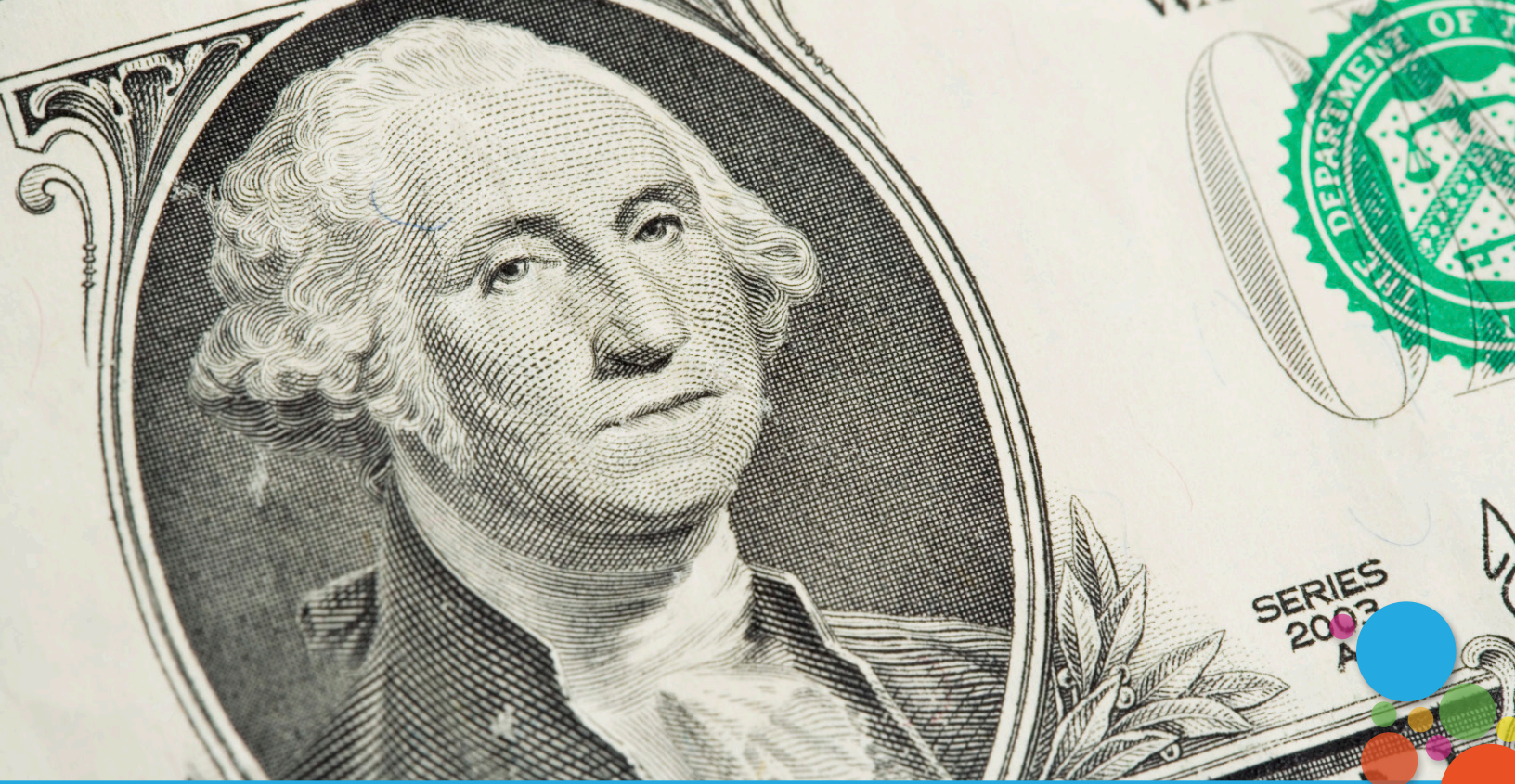

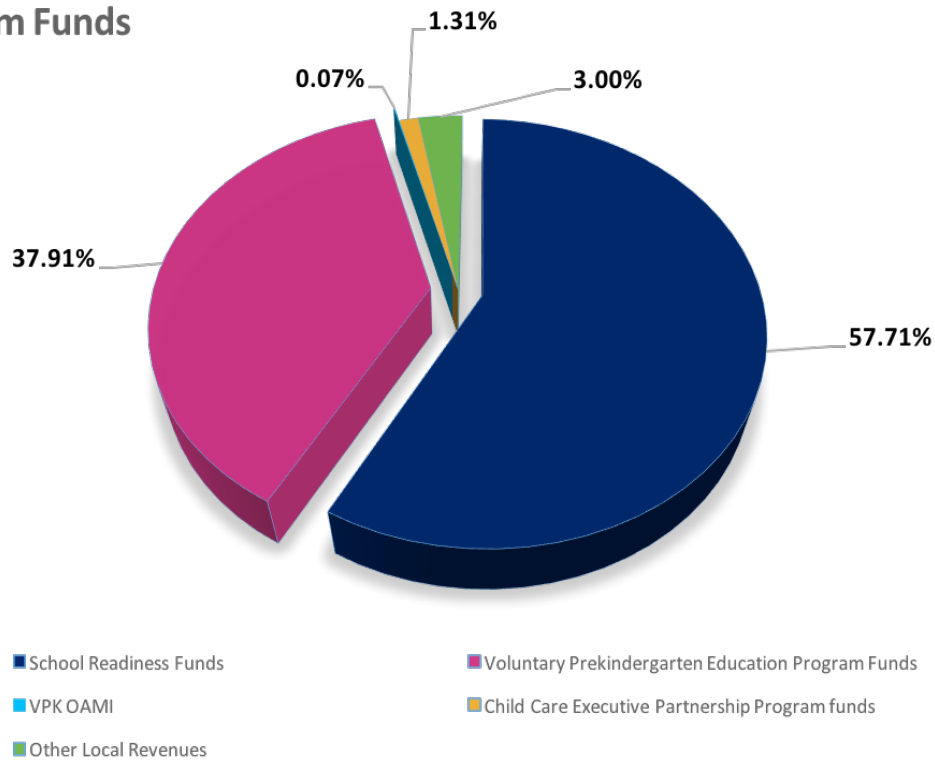

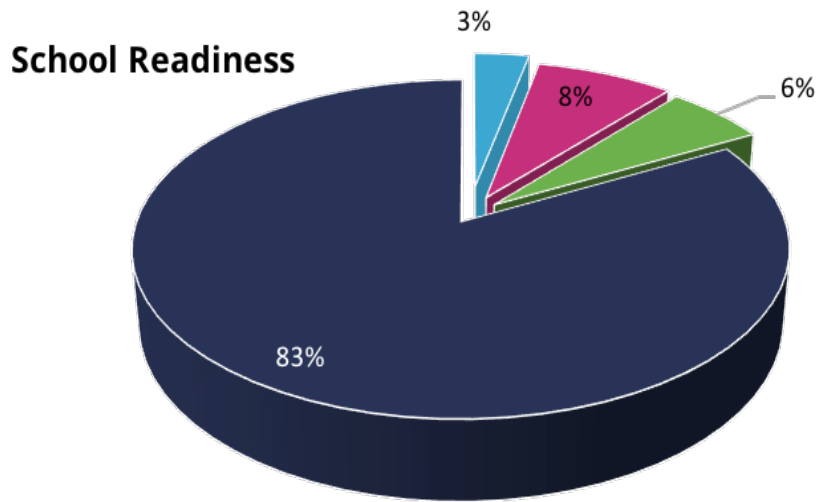

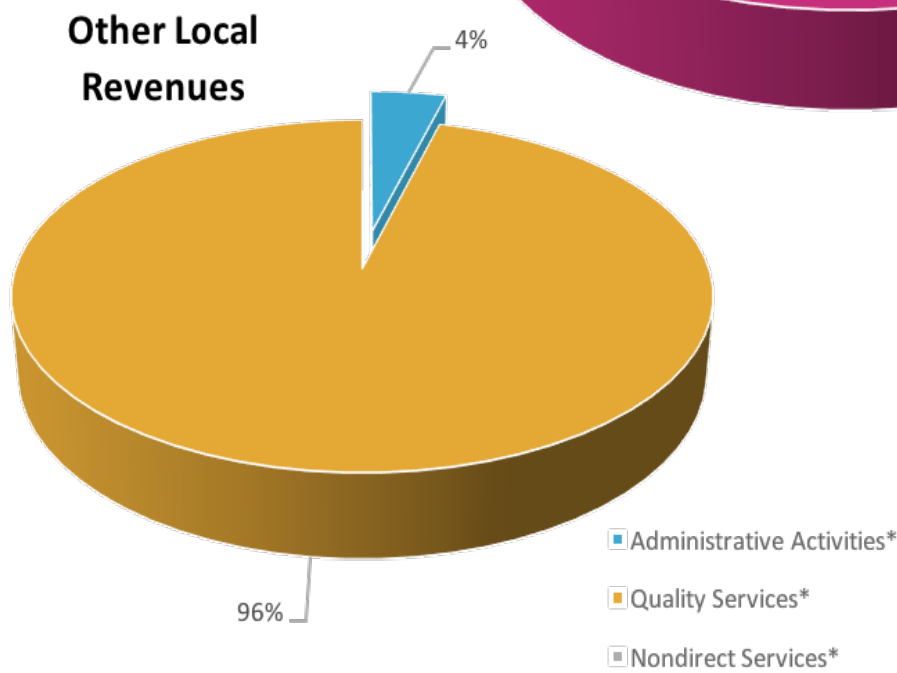

Age Appropriate Discipline

A New Year, Universal Resolutions! Do You Have all the Social Emotional Supports Your Need?

Participants will learn how to create universal social emotional supports for all of their children. Come learn from teachers who will share how they implement the Pyramid Model and use strategies and supports to promote clear expectations, schedules/routines, and child engagement. Make-and-take materials will be provided.

Biting, Scratching, Tantrums, Oh My!

Participants will gain knowledge about why toddlers engage in biting, scratching, tantrums, and other problem behaviors. In addition, participants will also learn how to respond to these challenging behaviors, understand the behaviors, and develop strategies to support children experiencing these behaviors.

Overview of the Pyramid Model and the Importance of Rules and Expectations

This workshop is one of a series of trainings that focuses on training early childhood educators to prevent, identify, and address challenging behaviors in young children. During this series, the presenter describes a model of evidence based practices that includes the following components: building relationships, creating supportive environments, social emotional teaching strategies, individually designed interventions for children with persistent challenging behavior, and barriers and administrative supports.

Responsive Café: Adult - Child Interactions with Infant and Toddlers

Participants will understand how their relationships impact the well being of infants and toddlers and be able to describe responsible care giving in all areas of the day. Participants learn how to increase language development using literacy with infants and toddlers.

Think it, Script it, Teach it! Technology Tips for Classroom Supports/Strategies

Participants will learn how to create fun interactive visuals supports, flannel board pieces, and scripted stories to teach toddlers and preschoolers social-emotional skills and how to follow directions. Participants are asked to bring a laptop to the training. We encourage participants to have Microsoft Office on their computer. Presenters will bring extra laptops for participants to use in groups of three. Make-and-take materials will be provided.

What Do You Do with the Mad that you Feel

Teachers will learn strategies to help children understand their feelings and appropriate ways to deal with them.

Character Development

Baby Behavior Building: A Book Nook Bash for Infants and Toddlers

This book nook bash is specially designed with our infant and toddler teachers in mind. We will share many book nook lesson plans and fun activities that are all based on children's stories. All book nook ideas are geared towards promoting the social emotional development of our very young children. There will be door prizes, minimal talk, and lots of make-and-take.

Bridging Friendships: Book Nook Bash

Join us and learn how to use children's literature to bridge friendship skills like turn-taking, sharing, complimenting, showing empathy, and kindness. We will share many book nook lesson plans and fun activities that are all based on children's stories. This session is focused on lessons and activities for 3 to 5 year olds. There will be door prizes, minimal talk and lots of make-and-take.

Individual Differences: Maximizing Children's Learning and Behavior

Each child is unique and your teaching should seek to maximize the potential in each of them. Gender, temperament, self-control and learning styles play a major role in how children learn and behave. Participants will discuss each of these factors, review the research, and learn how to shape teaching to account for them.

Peace Making Skills for Little Kids

Teachers will learn hands-on activities for children to help children develop skills and find creative and non-destructive ways to settle conflicts and live in harmony with themselves and others.

Social Emotional Literacy for Infants, Toddlers, and Twos

Teachers will learn that books are a fun way to engage children and to be more intentional about supporting and teaching social emotional development.

Toddlers and Preschoolers Can Learn Emotional Vocabulary

Did you know that kids have a hard time finding their "words" when they are emotional? Come find out how to begin teaching feeling words to young toddlers and how feeling vocabulary can grow all throughout the preschool years. Participants will learn how to teach understanding, identification, and self-regulation of emotions through fun and engaging activities. Make-and-take materials will be provided.

Will You Be My Friend?

Everybody needs friends. For many, this comes naturally, but some young children need direct instruction on what friendship skills are, how to use them and what it takes to maintain friendships. Participants will learn about evidence-based practices for teaching friendship skills and will have the opportunity to make-and-take materials to take back to the classroom for scaffolding positive interactions between peers.

Young Children Have Problems Too and the Solutions are Easy

When children have a problem, they do one of three things: withdraw, become aggressive, or they solve that problem through an acceptable solution. The goal of this make-and-take workshop is to supply participants with the child friendly tools to guide young children on how to learn to navigate through the steps of problem solving all the ways to a solution.

Developmentally Appropriate Curriculum

Baby Doll Circle Time

Come and see what Baby Doll Circle Time curriculum is all about. Learn how to use the curriculum with your Infants, Toddlers and 2s.

Back to School Bash – Mouse's First Day of School

"Mouse's First Day of School" by Lauren Thompson is the focus and Mouse is so excited to get back to school! When Mouse hides away in a backpack he finds a whole new world and a classroom full of fun. Come see how you can use this book to start off a new school year and teach children about counting, music, language, science and art!

Becoming a Better Early Childhood Teacher: Creating a Supportive & Caring Classroom

Come examine the ways you can build lasting relationships with children and your entire class. This workshop will focus on fostering meaningful connections to create a caring community within your classroom.

Becoming a Better Early Childhood Teacher: Creating a Well Organized Classroom

Explore the most effective way to manage the classroom through use of transitions, schedules and routines, learning materials, and classroom design. Additionally, participants will review and practice effective behavior guidance techniques.

Becoming a Better Early Childhood Teacher: Instructional Interactions that Matter

Review and practice engaging interactions that foster meaningful learning for children.

Cook-A-Doodle-Do! Fostering a Child's Understanding of Measurement

This presentation will provide preschool teachers with effective strategies for introducing measurement and engaging children in a variety of measuring activities. These strategies can be used throughout the year and include the following: measuring and comparing objects through the use of standard and non-standard units of measurement; creating charts and graphs for analyzing differences; predicting outcomes; and the introduction of new vocabulary.

Creating Special Moments with Infants and Toddlers

Special moments should occur more often than just celebrating children's birthdays or when developmental milestones are reached. Discover how to create special moments with infants and toddlers every day. Learn how to turn diaper changing and other routine tasks into special moments that you share with each child.

Creative Curriculum for Family Child Care Homes

The Creative Curriculum for Family Child Care is a comprehensive, research-based curriculum designed to inform understanding of what and how children of various ages learn. This 6-hour training will explore use of the 2 Volumes, DVDs and Learning Games resources to guide planning, on-going assessment and intentional, responsive care for all children in the home setting.

Creative Curriculum for Infants, Toddlers and Twos

During this two-day training participants will explore the three volumes of the Creative Curriculum for Infants, Toddlers and Twos in order to understand the importance of responsive care and to learn how to incorporate the 38 research-based objectives for development and learning in order to focus on what matters most for young children.

Creative Curriculum for Preschool

During this two-day training participants will explore the five volumes of the Creative Curriculum for Preschool in order to understand the importance of responsive care and to learn how to incorporate the 38 research-based objectives for development and learning in order to focus on what matters most for young children.

Developing Your Own Preschool Studies for Creative Curriculum is Easier than You Think!

Are you using the Creative Curriculum for Preschool but don't have the "system" with the collection of daily practice resources? OR do you just want to develop some additional studies of your own? If you said yes to either, this training is for you. Participants will explore the process of developing a study and how to make it meaningful based on the interest of the children in your classroom.

Early Childhood Development

Gain an understanding of what early brain development involves and how to promote it in your child care setting. Learn about social scaffolding and how to embed healthy nutrition and activity habits into the learning environment for young children.

Early Childhood Symposium for Infants & Toddlers

Teachers will attend 4 sessions learning hands-on activities for Literacy, Science, Social Emotional and How to use the ILP (Yellow Sheet).

Early Childhood Symposium for Preschool Teachers

Training will consist of three sessions that will include new strategies for use in the preschool classroom. Sessions shall be strategies to start the year off right [The Fabulous First 30 Days], Strategies for conducting read-alouds and shared reading techniques [Rockin' Reading Strategies] and how to use complete the ASQ-ILP [What Do I Do With That Yellow Sheet? Explore It! (Science) Design it! (Engineering) Use it! (Technology)

Hands-on activities to help care-givers understand the relevance of science, engineering, and technology in afterschool settings.

Family Child Care Home DACA

In this 3 day training, Family Child Care Home Providers will learn about the importance of building relationships with children and families, how to appropriately set up the learning environment with a daily routine and how to plan and implement appropriate activities.

Growing Up Wild

Growing Up Wild is an early childhood education program that builds on children's sense of wonder about nature and invites them to explore wildlife and the world around them.

Hands on! Minds on! Inquiry and Experiential Learning

Understanding inquiry and experiential learning helps youth workers capitalize on kids' interests, assure better learning outcomes and provide exciting learning opportunities for acquisition of science, engineering and technology knowledge and skills.

Hook 'Em with Books

Let's dive into this wonderful resource for new and veteran preschool teachers. Participants will spice up literacy activities with teacher-created and developmentally appropriate materials and activities. Participants will learn how to create a literacy-rich environment preparing preschoolers for Kindergarten. Participants will receive a copy of the NAEYC resource Learning About Language and Literacy in Preschool.

It's More Than Just Talking

Teachers will learn how to expand language and reasoning through the content areas.

Lesson Planning for Infants, Toddlers, and Twos Teachers

Teachers will learn how to use the Florida Early Learning and Developmental Standards Birth to Five Years to know the strengths and needs of their children and support them through writing developmentally appropriate lesson plans.

Lesson Planning for Preschool Teachers

Teachers will learn how to use the Florida Early Learning and Developmental Standards (2010) Birth to Five Years to know the strengths and needs of their children and support them through writing developmentally appropriate lesson plans.

Let's Do It Write! Fostering Children's Fine Motor Skills

This training will explore a variety of strategies and provide activities to assist with the development of fine motor skills in preschool age children. Ideas for the development of pre-writing skills, as well as the development of self help proficiency skills, such as buttoning buttons, zipping zippers, and tying shoes will be shared. Come learn important strategies to improve children's handwriting efficiency through fine motor activities, exercises, and finger plays.

Literacy in Early Childhood

This workshop enables teachers to identify, practice, and implement components of a literacy rich classroom. Learn how to set up the classroom to support literacy activities, and learn how to plan and implement literacy activities for large groups, small groups, and individual learners.

Coaches Booster Workshop Part 1

The focus of this workshop is on teaming to develop targeted and individualized positive behavior support plans for children with challenging behavior.

Coaches Booster Workshop Part 2

The focus of this workshop is on teaming to develop targeted and individualized positive behavior support plans for children with challenging behavior.

Popeye and Brutus: Understanding Bullying and Children

The focus of this training is recognizing and understanding bullying in young children. Participants will learn the types of bullying, prevention and how to collaborate with parents regarding this sensitive topic.

Management and Administration

Introduction to the Business Administration Scale (BAS)

Family child care home providers who utilize effective professional business practices are more likely to provide a high-quality learning environment for the children in their care. This training will look at the items and subscales of the BAS and how they support quality.

Introduction to the Program Administration Scale (PAS)

Without quality systems in place at the organizational level, high quality interactions and learning environments at the classroom level cannot be sustained. This session for child care center directors and owners will explore the items and subscales of the PAS tool that support quality efforts in both program leadership and management.

QCFK Orientation for Early Childhood Centers

This session is designed to offer owners and directors an opportunity to get acquainted with the fundamental concepts of the Quality Counts for Kids Improvement Program.

QCFK Orientation for Family Child Care Homes

This session is designed to offer family child care home providers an opportunity to get acquainted with the fundamental concepts of the Quality Counts for Kids Improvement Program.

QCFK Self-Study for Early Childhood Centers

Early Childhood Center owners and directors will learn about the seven standards of Quality Counts for Kids, receive the materials used to navigate the self-study and learn about the QCFK continuous quality improvement process.

This module blends the nurturing and business sides of family child care. Sound knowledge of business management skills is important to the successful operation of a family child care home. Many providers with strong skills in other areas are unprepared to deal with the business practices that assist in the smooth operation of a small business.

Second Helping: The Provider

Family child care providers have responsibilities to fulfill with their family, clients, children in care and their business. The output of energy is tremendous. Many providers approaching burnout describe the "empty cup" syndrome. This module becomes the foundation for the remaining modules by focusing on the provider. Since the provider—as an individual—is at the very core of quality child care, it is recommended that this module be completed first.

The Odd Couple: Collaboration and Teamwork

In this training, teachers will learn the diversity of work styles that create different types of personalities and how they impact the work environment.

What Your Need to Lead: Collaborating with Change

In this session, participants will examine methods for collaborating with staff, other administrators, and parents to promote change.

What Your Need to Lead: Five Essential Leadership Skills

In this session, participants will explore the five most important skills required to lead and advance their early childhood program.

What Your Need to Lead: Getting Started

In this session, participants will identify their strengths and areas from which to grow to build their programs.

What Your Need to Lead: Leading with Purpose

In this session, participants will look at the power of having clearly a defined purpose and how that can guide their leadership.

What Your Need to Lead: Smart Head-to-Heart Leadership

In this session, participants will explore the role of emotional intelligence in leadership.

What Your Need to Lead: The Art and Science of Decision Making

In this session, participants will review the factors associated with making tough decisions in their program(s).

Program Evaluation

Introduction to the Early Childhood Environment Rating Scale (ECERS-R)

Participants will explore the items, subscales and the rating and scoring process of the ECERS-R tool, which is designed to assess preschool classrooms for children from 30 months through five years of age.

Introduction to the Family Child Care Environment Rating Scale (FCCERS-R)

Participants will explore the items, subscales and the rating and scoring process of the FCCERS-R tool, which is designed to assess family child home programs for children from infancy to school age.

Introduction to the Infant Toddler Environment Rating Scale (ITERS-R)

Participants will explore the items, subscales and the rating and scoring process of the ITERS-R tool, which is designed to assess infant toddler classrooms for children from infancy through 30 months of age.

Introduction to the School-Age Care Environment Rating Scale (SACERS)

Participants will explore the items, subscales and the rating and scoring process of the SACERS tool, which is designed to assess school-age classrooms for children over five years of age.

Screening and Assessment

Ages and Stages Questionnaire: Social Emotional

The focus of this workshop is on screening young children at risk of social emotional delays. The workshop will also cover effective strategies that promote social- emotional development and address challenging behavior in young children.

ASQ Training English

This two hour Information Session educates participants on the benefits of using developmental screenings with children, and explains the local and state mandate regarding developmental screenings with School Readiness children. It describes the ASQ 3rd Edition, and offers practice completing and scoring the ASQ-3 in accordance with Law 7165. In addition, information will be provided regarding the Early Learning Coalition Hillsborough County mandate on submitting and maintaining completed ASQ's, as well as your partnership with the School Readiness Screening & Assessment team.

ASQ Training-Spanish

This two hour Information Session educates participants on the benefits of using developmental screenings with children, and explains the local and state mandate regarding developmental screenings with School Readiness children. It describes the ASQ 3rd Edition, and offers practice completing and scoring the ASQ-3 in accordance with Law 7165. In addition, information will be provided regarding the Early Learning Coalition Hillsborough County mandate on submitting and maintaining completed ASQ's, as well as your partnership with the School Readiness Screening & Assessment team.

Introduction to teaching Strategies GOLD

Ongoing observation of children while they are involved in regular, everyday activities provides a meaningful snapshot of a child's development. In this training, participants will receive an introduction to Teaching Strategies GOLD (TSG) which is a valid and reliable system for assessing children from birth through kindergarten. In day one, the four steps of the assessment cycle, the 38 Objectives for Development and how to use these to meet individual children's needs will be explored. During day two, participants will have a hands-on opportunity to learn how to use the features of TSG including uploading documentation, entering observation notes and updating checkpoints.

Making the Most of Classroom Interactions (MMCI)

MMCI helps early childhood professionals engage with the Classroom Assessment Scoring System (CLASS) as they identify and understand the interactions that increase children's learning and development. Participants will: examine the impact of teacher-child interactions and relationships on children's learning, identify teacher- child interactions that affect child outcomes, and learn how to use the CLASS observation tool for considering teaching practices and guiding observations of classroom videos and real-life interactions.

Observation, Documentation and Intentionality in Early Childhood Classrooms

Get tuned into your inner detective! Learn how to observe and document "just the facts" in order to truly know and understand each child's potential and to make teaching easier. Practice observation techniques and strategies to embed them into your daily routines and to connect observations to assessment. While this training will reference the 38 Objectives for Development & Learning in the Creative Curriculum and Teaching Strategies GOLD, these activities will benefit early childhood teachers using any assessment of learning.

NARRATIVE:

Executive Summary

The Voluntary Prekindergarten Estimating Conference met on August 2, 2016 to review final 2014-15 school year and 2015 summer data, preliminary 2015-16 school year and summer data reported through June 2016, and a revised four-year-old population data series; in addition to adopting a forecast through 2021-22.

Recent data reported through June 2016 contained several indicators that a change to the Conference's forecast was warranted: (1) a small increase in 2015-16 VPK school year full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollment; (2) a slight increase in the ratio between 2015-16 VPK school year FTE and enrollment; and (3) a decline in the 2016 summer FTE enrollment. Overall, the new data led the Conference to increase FY 2015-16 FTE by 366.42 FTE. However, the collective impact of the factors described above generally placed downward pressure on the forecast for all subsequent years, resulting in a new forecast for FY 2016-17 that was relatively unchanged from the January 2016 VPK Conference.

The new forecast uses the most recent ratio of FTE-to-enrollment (2015-16 school year and 2015 summer) and includes estimates for the Specialized Instructional Services Program (SISP). Overall, the new forecast decreases the estimates for FY 2016-17 by 16.15 FTE enrollment. The revised forecast for Fiscal Years 2017-18 through 2020-21 show reductions that range between 7.68 and 168.97 FTE enrollment when compared to the January 2016 VPK Conference.

The new forecast produces a participation rate of at least 78.1%, which is a decrease of about 0.2 percentage points from the January 2016 VPK Conference.
