THE LEARNING MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

A Way for You to Plan and Manage Your Professional Development

What is a Learning Management System and What does it mean to Providers?

Without getting into too much technical jargon, a Learning Management System (LMS) is a webbased application that acts as a framework to handle all aspects of the learning process. IECP's LMS delivers and manages instructional content, helps the IECP and the Coalition identify and assess individual and organizational learning goals, tracks progress toward meeting those goals and collects data that is needed about our courses and learning processes.

What this means for providers is that registration and payment for all IECP trainings and workshops is conducted online. Providers may also access online courses and communities of practice, as well as early care and education resources via the LMS.

How to Use the Learning Management System (LMS)

Everyone wishing to take a workshop or course **MUST** register using the Learning Management System (LMS). Paper registrations are no longer accepted.


