

THE LEARNING MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

A Way for You to Plan and Manage Your Professional Development

What is a Learning Management System and What does it mean to Providers?

Without getting into too much technical jargon, a Learning Management System (LMS) is a web-based application that acts as a framework to handle all aspects of the learning process. IECP's LMS delivers and manages instructional content, helps the IECP and the Coalition identify and assess individual and organizational learning goals, tracks progress toward meeting those goals and collects data that is needed about our courses and learning processes.

What this means for providers is that registration for all IECP trainings and workshops is conducted online. Providers may also access online courses and communities of practice, as well as early care and education resources via the LMS.

How to Use the Learning Management System (LMS)

Everyone wishing to take a workshop or course **MUST** register using the Learning Management System (LMS). Paper registrations are no longer accepted.

REGISTRATION

All registrations for IECP trainings and workshops are now conducted on the Learning Management System (LMS) (*see page 2 for more information*). Registrations are received on a first-come, first-serve basis and seating is limited in each face-to-face session. **A LMS account is required for all training registrations regardless if payment is necessary or type of payment used.**

PAYMENT

Payment (*if required*) can be made online via Stripe at the time of registration. Cash or money order accepted, on location, 48 hours prior to a learning event.

REGISTRATION CANCELLATION POLICY

Registrants have up to 48 hours before a scheduled training to cancel. A refund will be made to the Stripe account on file. Cash or money order payments will be issued a credit through the LMS if a training is cancelled 48 hours prior, or if we cancel a training due to low enrollment or unexpected events.

TRAINING CANCELLATION POLICY

The training sponsor reserves the right to cancel trainings if registration is low. If a training session is cancelled, those registered will be contacted by email and notified of the cancellation. A credit will be applied to the Stripe account on file.
